Wherefore the law is holy, and the commandment holy, and just, and good. Rom. 7:12

The polls at the above designated polling place shall on election day by open from 7 o'clock a. m. to 7 o'clock p.m.

- 4. Judy Hartman is hereby appointed Clerk for absentee voting. The absentee voting for the above designated election shall be held at the School Office, Santa Anna ISD within the boundries of the above named School District and said place of absentee voting shall remain open at least eight hours on each day for absentee voting which is not a Saturday, a Sunday or an official State holiday, beginning on the 20th day and continuing through the 4th day preceding the date of said election. 


