## Many Candidates For ISD, City

### Six Seek Positions On School Board

Six candidates will appear on the April 5 School Trustee ballot, with three places to be filled.

Incumbents Eddie Wayne Hartman, Glen Scarborough and Orabeth McIver have filed for

re-election, and others to appear on the ballot will be Montie L. Guthrie III, Donald Strickland and Polly Warnock.

Guthrie, a former teacher now employed in the construction business, was the first to file for the election. Strickland is employed in Brownwood and is active in many organizations here. Mrs. Warnock, a Santa

Anna native, is also active in school, church and community groups and is bookkeeper for her husband's machine shop and transport business.

Deadline for filing for the election was Wednesday, March 5.

### Five Candidates For City Council

Two additional candidates joined the City Council race last week before the Wednesday deadline, making five competing for the three places on the Council.

Patrick Hosch and Scott Patterson were the last to file for a place on the April 5 ballot. Others on the ballot will be Lin Wristen, John Pearce and Eddie Jones.

Patterson is the only incumbent seeking re-election. Stanley Hartman and Quinton Daniel are not seeking re-election.

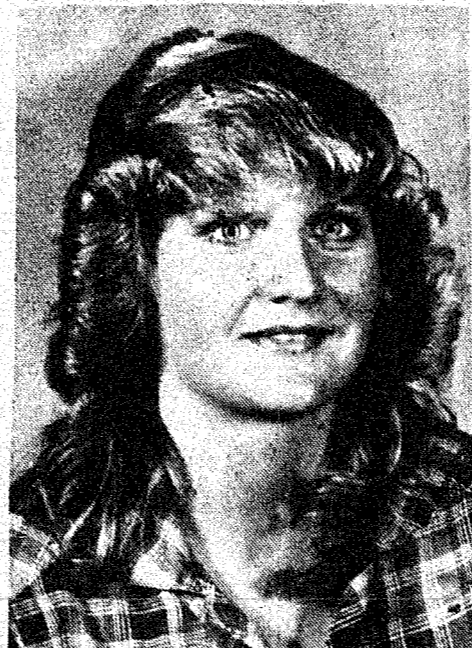

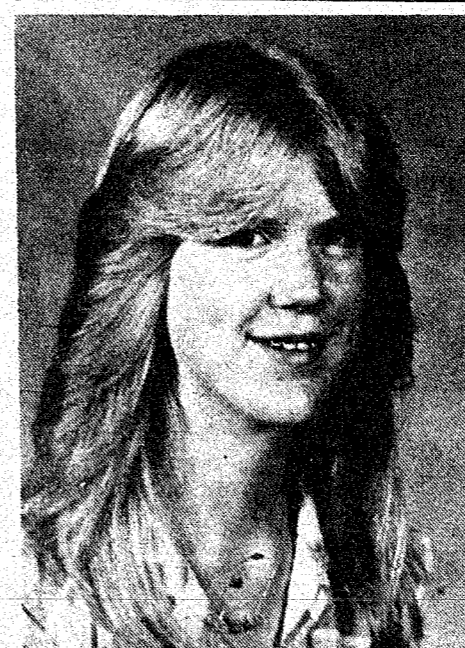

A request was heard from the City of Bangs to use the Santa Anna City Landfill for their garbage disposal. The matter was tabled for further study. Bangs is currently contracting with Brownwood for their garbage disposal.

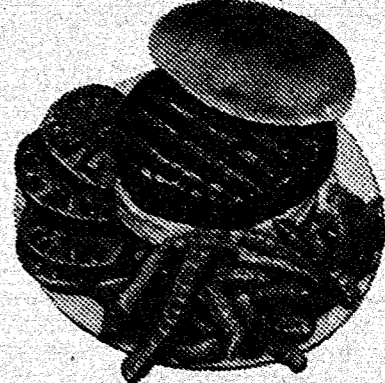

Wherefore the law is holy, and the commandment holy, and just, and good. Rom. 7:12

As the Supreme Ruler of the universe, God has ordained laws for the government not only of all living beings, but of all the operations of nature.
