Rabies Clinic Set Saturday

Santa Anna pet owners will have an opportunity to get their pets vaccinated for rabies at a city-wide clinic Saturday, May 10, at the Fire Hall. Dr. Cathy Pearce will be on hand from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. to vaccinate dogs and cats for rabies, and other vaccinations will be available.

This is the first rabies clinic in Santa Anna this year, and a good response is expected. Vaccination of pets for rabies is now a state law, enforceable by cities and counties, and proof of vaccination is required to license dogs in Santa Anna.

George Fuller Elected Lions Club President

George Fuller was elected president of Santa Anna Lions Club at the meeting Tuesday, April 29. He will succeed Scott Patterson as president of the group.

Tuesday Night Rainfall Boosts 1980 Total

The largest one-day rainfall total of the year was recorded Wednesday, May 7, with 1.75 inches at the official gauge in Santa Anna. Up to three inches of rain fell in areas south of town during the night.

Saturday of last week had .21 inch recorded after traces of rain fell in town Thursday and Friday.

Rainfall for April totaled only .74 inch, recorded on three days last month. The 1980 total now stands at 6.33 inches.

The public is invited to attend the roping Friday afternoon.

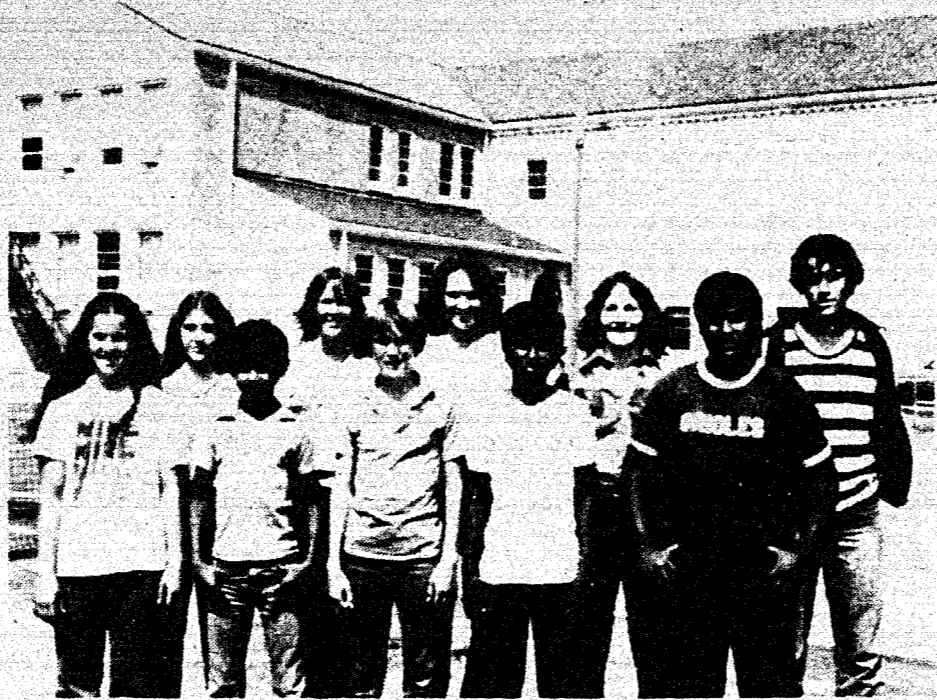






Elgean Shield Buried Here Last Monday

Funeral services were held Monday, May 5, at St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Coleman for Elgean Shield, 78, who died Saturday morning, May 3, in the Veterans Hospital in Temple after a long illness. The Rev. John Holmes, pastor, officiated at the service, and military graveside rites were held in the Santa Anna Cemetery under direction of Stevens Funeral Home of Coleman.

Mr. Shield was born in Santa Anna September 14, 1901, the son of the late L. L. and Caroline (Hubert) Shield. He married Flora Jenkins May 22, 1930 in Columbus, Ga. He was a rancher, a geologist, and a retired U. S. Army colonel, serving from 1923 to 1953. He was a member of St. Mark's Episcopal Church.

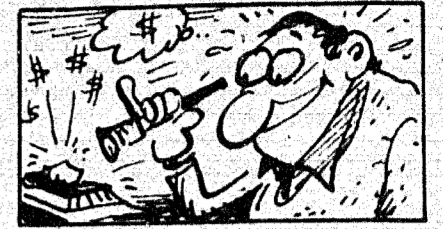

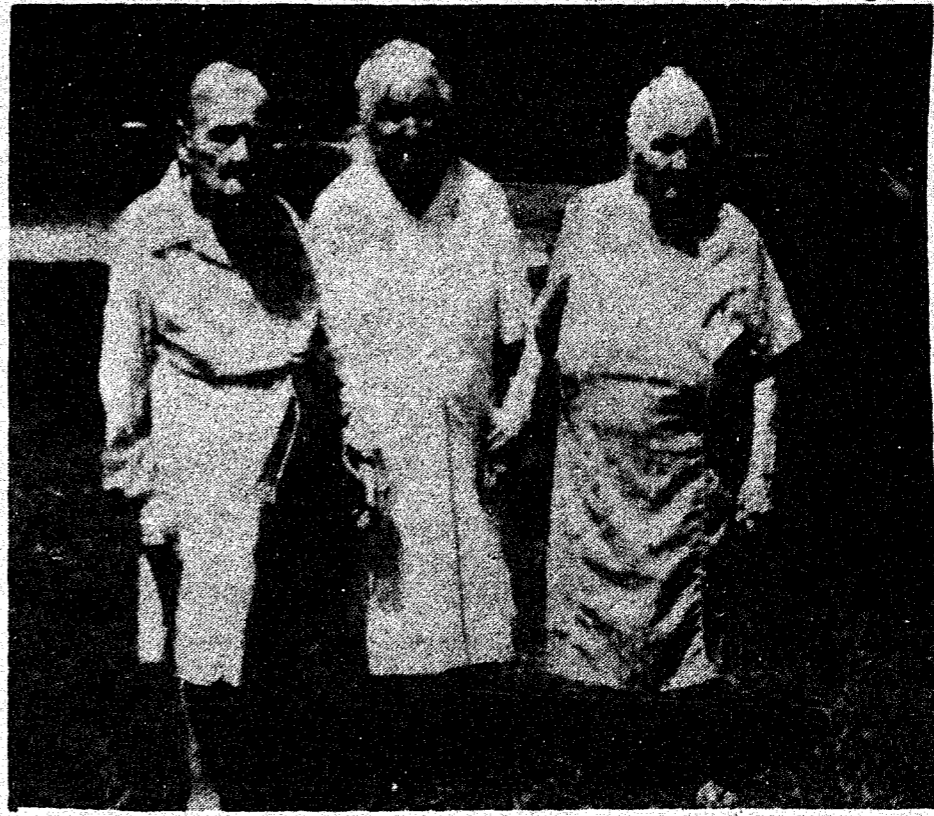
Mrs. Henderson enjoys piecing quilts, and one of her recent ones, a gift to a great-granddaughter, won a second prize in the Big Spring County Fair.

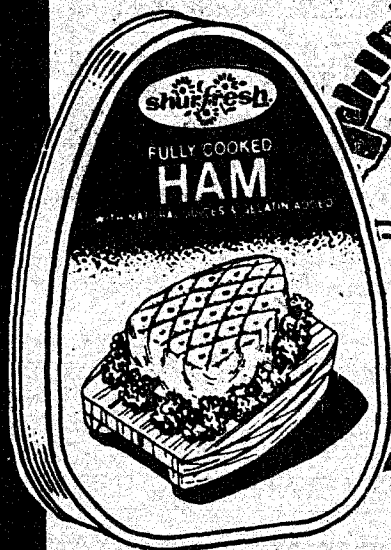

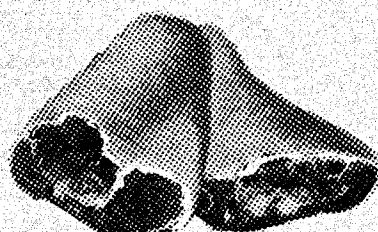
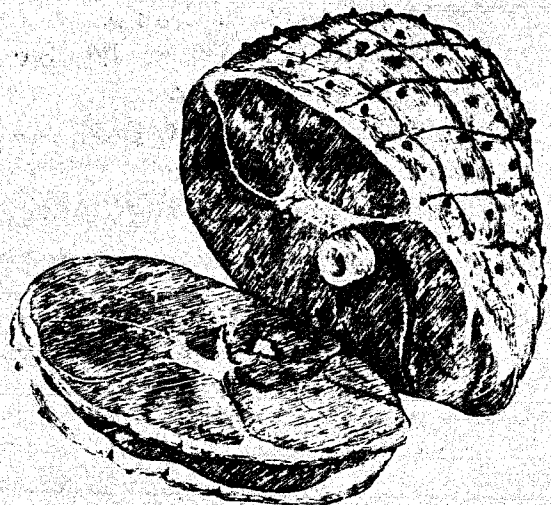
