They teach that no one who tries to appear what he is not, or whose words do not convey the real sentiment of his heart, can be called truthful...

Everything that Christians do should be as transparent as the sunlight. Truth is God; deception, in every one of its myriad forms, is of Satan....We can not speak the truth unless our minds are continually guided by Him who is truth.
