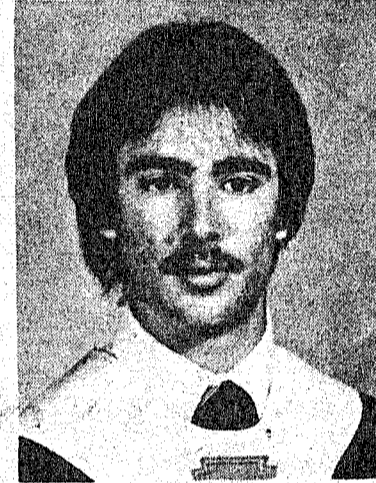

One of the final State UIL contests of the year will be held Saturday, May 29, at the University of Texas in Austin.

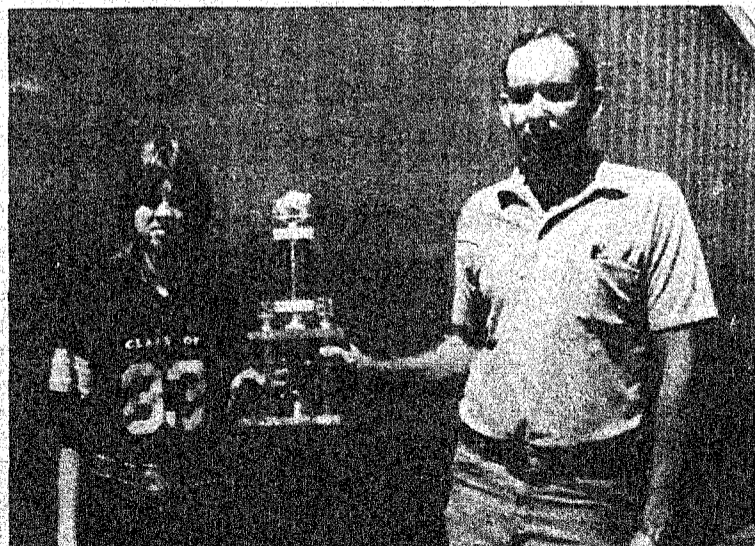
The State Twirling contests are scheduled that day, with three Santa Anna girls to take part.

Funeral services were held at Rockwood Baptist Church Monday, May 24, for Bill Steward, 74, of Rockwood who died Saturday, May 22, at Brackenridge Hospital in Austin after a sudden illness. Masonic graveside rites were held in the Rockwood Cemetery, the services under the direction of Henderson Funeral Home. The Rev. David Morris of Rochelle was officiating minister.

Mr. Steward and his wife were in Austin to attend the graduation of a granddaughter at the University of Texas when he suffered an apparent heart attack at the motel where they were staying.

He was born January 4, 1908 in Rockwood, the son of the late Jim and Maud (Rutherford) Steward. He was a lifetime resident of Rockwood, graduating from school there. He married Vivian Wise in Brownwood December 22, 1932. He was a construction worker and stock farmer and a Baptist. He was a member of Mountain Masonic Lodge.

Survivors are his wife; a daughter, Mrs. Pat (Kay) Patterson of Shreveport, La.; a son Collins Steward of Katy; two sisters, Mrs. Jack Cooper of Rockwood and Mrs. Denver Ellis of Coleman; a twin brother, Johnnie Steward of Rockwood; and six grandchildren. A sister, Sissie Steward, died in 1980.

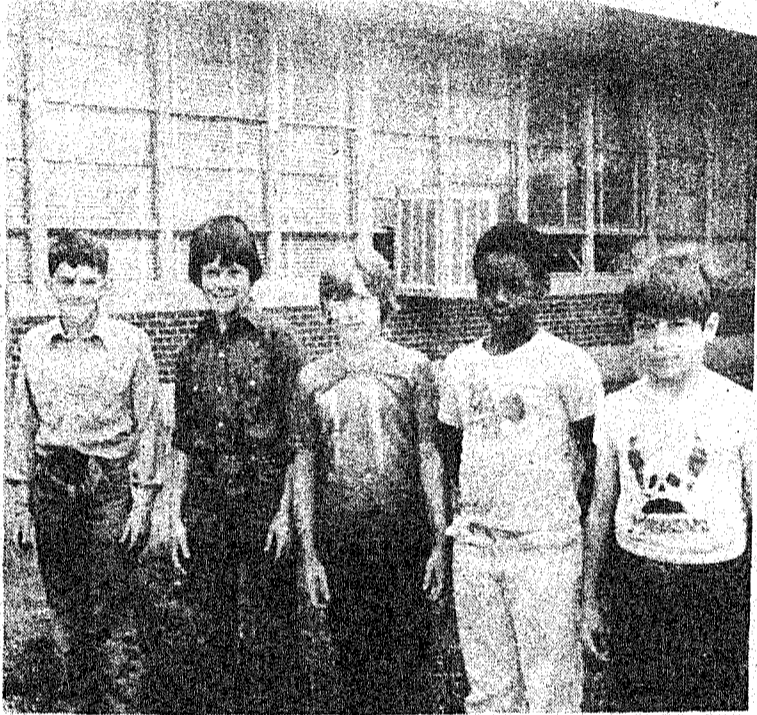

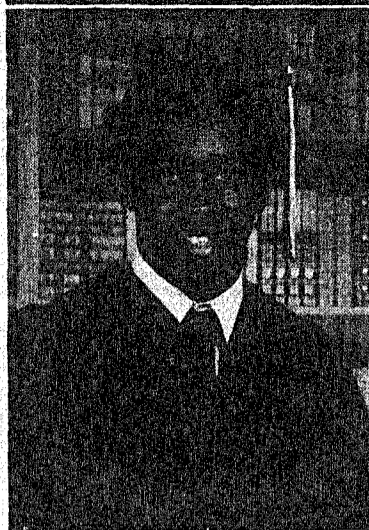
He wants to become a coach, but at the present time plans to attend a trade school to learn diesel mechanics or auto body repair.

TABS Test Scores Listed For Santa Anna

During the last two weeks of February, the Santa Anna schools administered the Texas Assessment of Basic Skills Tests to twenty-four third graders, thirty-two fifth graders, twenty-seven ninth graders, three tenth graders and one from the eleventh grade.

The results of these tests are

given as a percentage of the students mastering each of the objectives tested in the areas of math, reading and writing.

On the third grade math test, 100 percent of the students tested mastered five of the ten objectives; 96 percent mastered two of the remaining objectives; 92 percent mastered one objective; 58 percent mastered order whole numbers; and 63 percent mastered units of measure.

On the third grade reading test, all the group mastered three of the eight objectives; 91 percent mastered three of the objectives; 78 percent mastered the main idea; and 74 percent mastered the sequence of events.

On the third grade writing test, 100 percent mastered two of the five objectives; 96 percent mastered one objective; and 87 percent mastered punctuation and English usage.

The writing sample can be scored from 0 to 4, with 4 the highest rank, received by four percent of the students tested. Another four percent scored 3; 52 percent scored a 2; and 39 percent received 1. One-hundred percent of the students in the third grade received acceptable score on handwriting.

On the fifth grade math test, 100 percent of the students mastered units of measure and graphs. 90 percent to 97 percent mastered five of the objectives; 84 percent to 87 percent mastered three of the objectives; and 74 percent mastered word problems, multiplication, division and fractions.

On the fifth grade reading test, 91 - 97 percent of the students mastered four of the objectives; 75 - 88 percent mastered three of the objectives; and 53 percent mastered drawing conclusions.

On the fifth grade writing test, 100 percent mastered spelling; 84 - 94 percent mastered three objectives; 71 percent mastered English usage; and 55 percent mastered punctuation. On the writing sample, 10 percent received 3; 61 percent received 2; and 29 percent received 1. All the students received acceptable in handwriting.

One-hundred percent of the ninth grade students mastered add-subtract in the math test. 93 - 96 percent mastered three of the objectives; 63 - 78 percent mastered five of the objectives; and 52 percent mastered solving personal finance problems.

Thirty-three of the ninth graders mastered using ratio - proportion - percent. For the total math test, 67 percent of the students mastered, with those who did not master the total test allowed to take it again next year.

On the ninth grade reading test, 80 percent to 92 percent mastered two of the objectives; 72 - 76 percent mastered three of the objectives; 60 - 68 percent mastered four of the objectives; and 56 percent mastered using parts of a book.

Fifty-two percent mastered distinguishing fact from non-fact; and 72 percent of the students mastered the total reading test.

On the ninth grade writing test, 100 percent of the students mastered capitalization; 88 - 92 percent mastered three objectives; 72 percent mastered English usage; and 92 percent mastered spelling.

On the writing sample, 4 percent received a 4; 32 percent received a 3; 52 percent received a 2; and 12 percent received a 1. An acceptable score was received

by 96 percent of the students, with four percent scored hard to read. The total writing test was passed by 88 percent of the group. The Santa Anna administration

will study the results of these tests to determine curriculum planning to improve the weaker areas. The goal will be at least 85 percent mastery in all objectives.

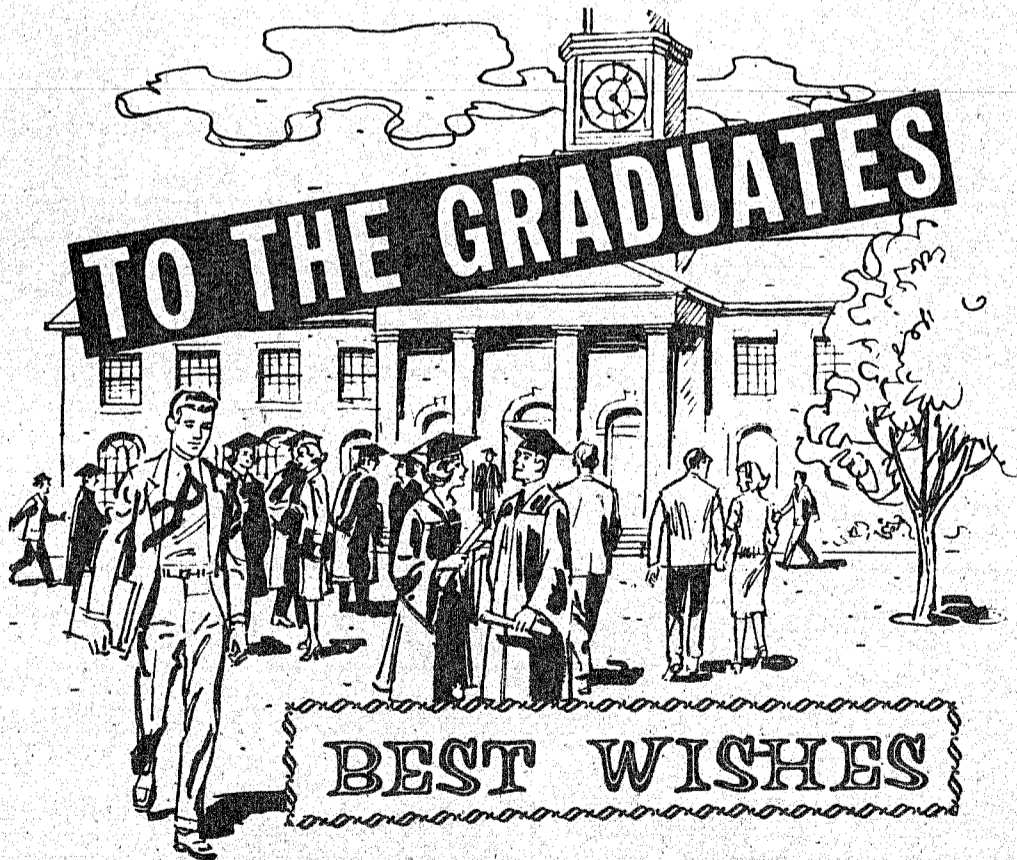

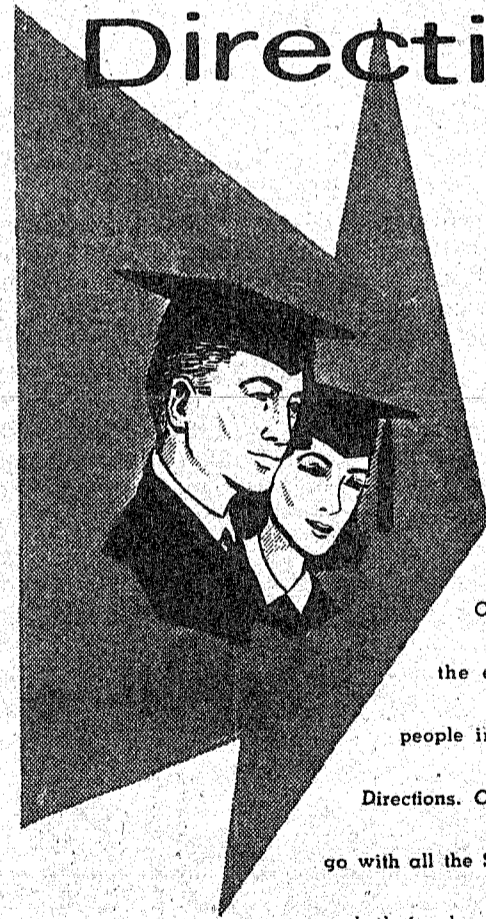

First, I would like to clarify the purpose of the Coleman County Historical Commission. Every county in the state of Texas has a historical commission as set up by the Texas Historical Commission, as established by an amendment of the state constitution. Some counties are very active (and seem to have a lot of history to preserve), others exist in name only, with no participation. Members are appointed by the Commission's Court and report to the Commission's Court. Its purpose is to preserve the historical heritage of the county, and to carry out a continuing survey of the county to determine the existence of historical buildings, and other historical sites, private collections of historical memorabilia, or other historical features within the county. At present, our local commission is in the process of reorganizing itself by setting up bylaws under which to work and committees to delegate the necessary work. As many of you have asked about "joining" the Historical Commission, we are trying to incorporate into our bylaws a method of having a larger membership...rather than establishing a separate group of interested historical and genealogical folks. More on this when bylaws have been established. The Coleman County Historical Commission meets the third Wednesday of every month at 3 p.m. in the Commission's Court-

room of the Coleman County Courthouse.

The Texas Department of Agriculture will open registration for the Family Land Heritage Program on May 15, 1982 and will continue through August 15, 1982. I think that most of the long time land owners in the county are familiar with this program. This marks the eighth year that the TDA has registered and published in book form, any family that has owned the same land for 100 years or more, can be any amount of acreage, but must show at least \$50 in agricultural sales per year...The TDA does not check sales records of anything of that sort...they pretty much go by the records that you furnish. If anyone in the County wishes information, please contact me. The Historical Commission will be glad to help, even if you only think that your land might qualify, but records are scarce, let us know...we will help. Thus far, only three landowners of Coleman County have qualified for this honor...these are Pecan Bayou Farms (1980 owners, Mr. and Mrs. Joe Carlos Golsen of Burkett), Young Ranch (1979 owner, Roy Deane Young of Burkett), and Home Base (1977 owners, Mr. and Mrs. Grady McIver of Trickham).

I have received several queries of genealogical nature...if anyone wishes to write, I will put their query in this column. I am currently working up a form for anyone that has roots in Coleman County, whether they are seeking information or would like to have their information on file to share with others...these forms will be house at the new library when it is opened.

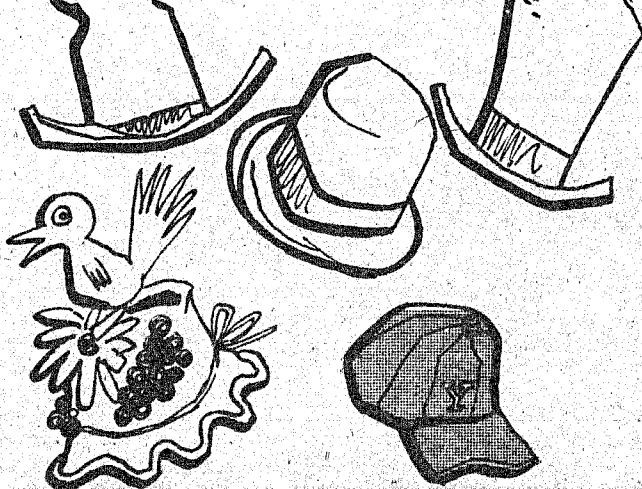

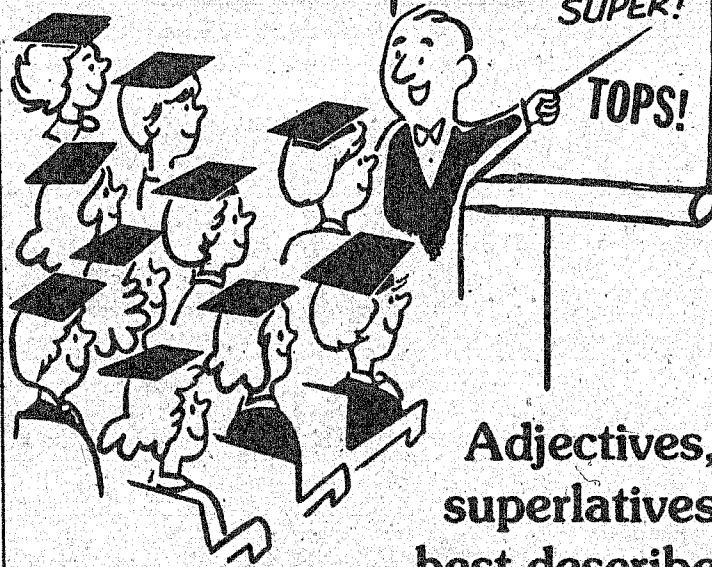

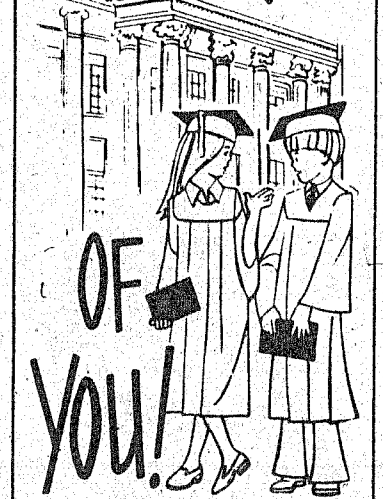

In a return match Monday night, the Cubs again won a close 7-6 match that went into an extra inning. Ramon Vasquez was pitcher of the last contest.

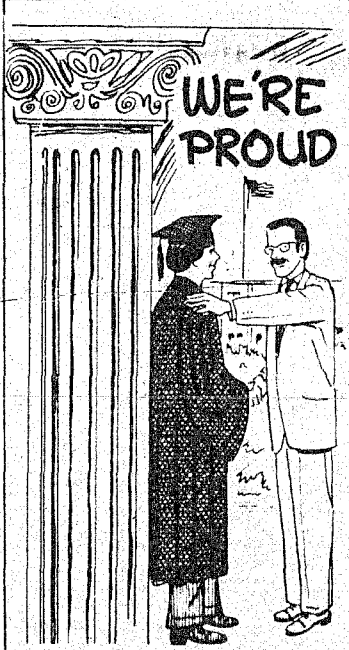

Severe infestations can destroy the entire pecan crop, and those with pecan trees should be alert to the danger and be prepared to spray for the insects between May 25 - 29.

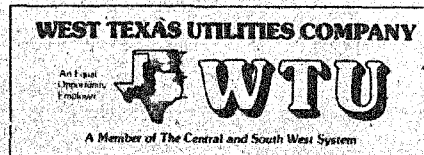



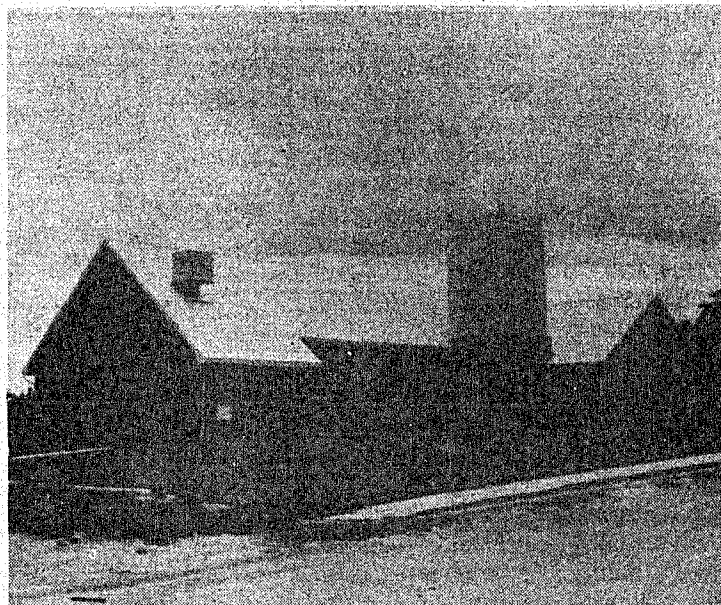
