Another stage called the Iambada has developed since Brother Mitchell's article. This dance actually looks like two people trying to have sexual intercourse while standing upright on the dance floor.

1985 that requires all 5 th and 8th grade students to be screened for spinal deformities. Early detection f abnormal spinal curvature can prevent serious health problems. This is a problem that may begin from 10-14 years of age), with an estimated 1 in 10 adolescents having some degree of abnormal curvature.

Curves that are detected early may only require periodic observation by specialist. Moderate curves may which is usually supervised by an orthopedic specialist. In most cases, the need for major surgery for this deformity can be eliminated hrough early detection.
