New Police Officer Hired

The Santa Anna City Council met in a called session last Thursday evening (June 19, 1986). The Council accepted Henry Turner's verbal resignation that was received Friday afternoon by City Secretary Vikki Wristen.

Mr. Turner walked into the City Hall office late Friday afternoon, laid his keys, badge, and handcuffs on the counter and said, "I'm through. I'm quitting!" and walked out.

Turner gave the city no reason for his resignation, though the news office has been informed that Turner was at odds with the council over the manner in which the job should be handled.

Mr. Turner was hired in April to take over the job vacated by Bill Allen, who has been indicted on arson charges and is awaiting trial in 42nd District Court. Turner's appointment was temporary pending the outcome of Allen's case.

After interviewing three (3) applicants the City Council hired Craig C. Terry of Knox City as a temporary police officer, again pending the outcome of Bill Allen's case. Terry has had many years of experience including being trained for the military police. He has worked for the Colorado City police force and the Knox City police force most recently. Mr. Terry is married and the couple plan to make their residence here in Santa Anna.

welcome and encouraged to participate.

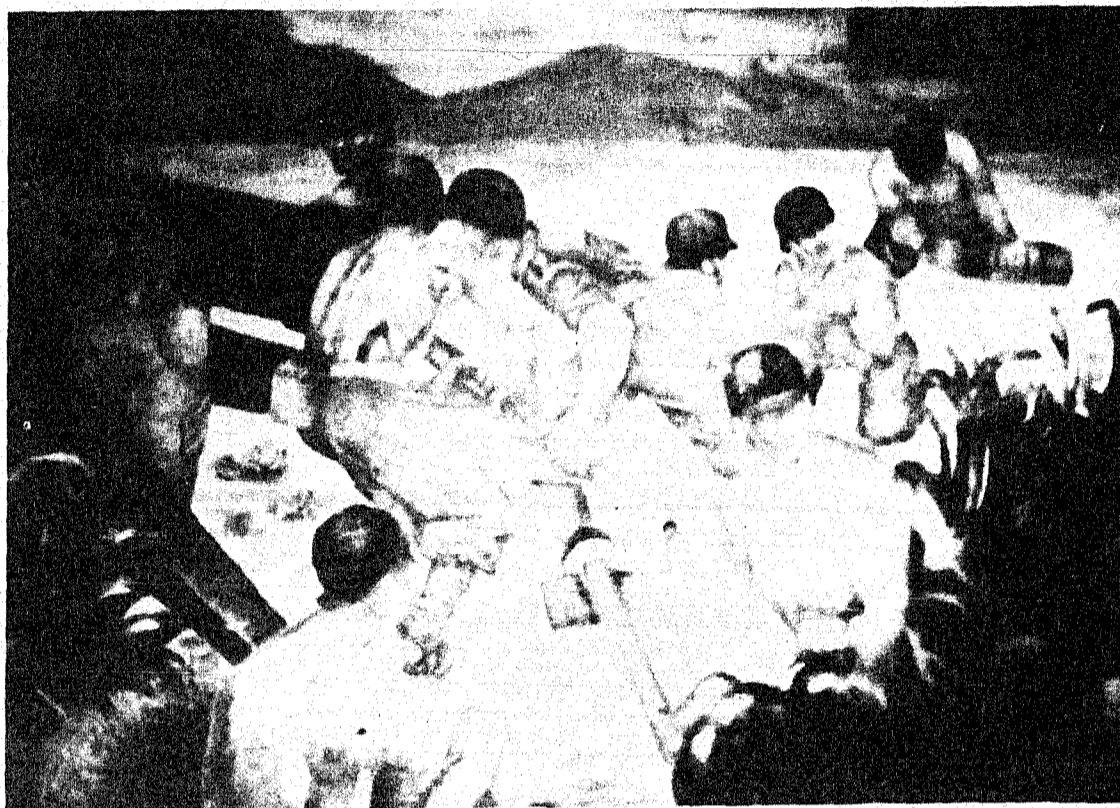

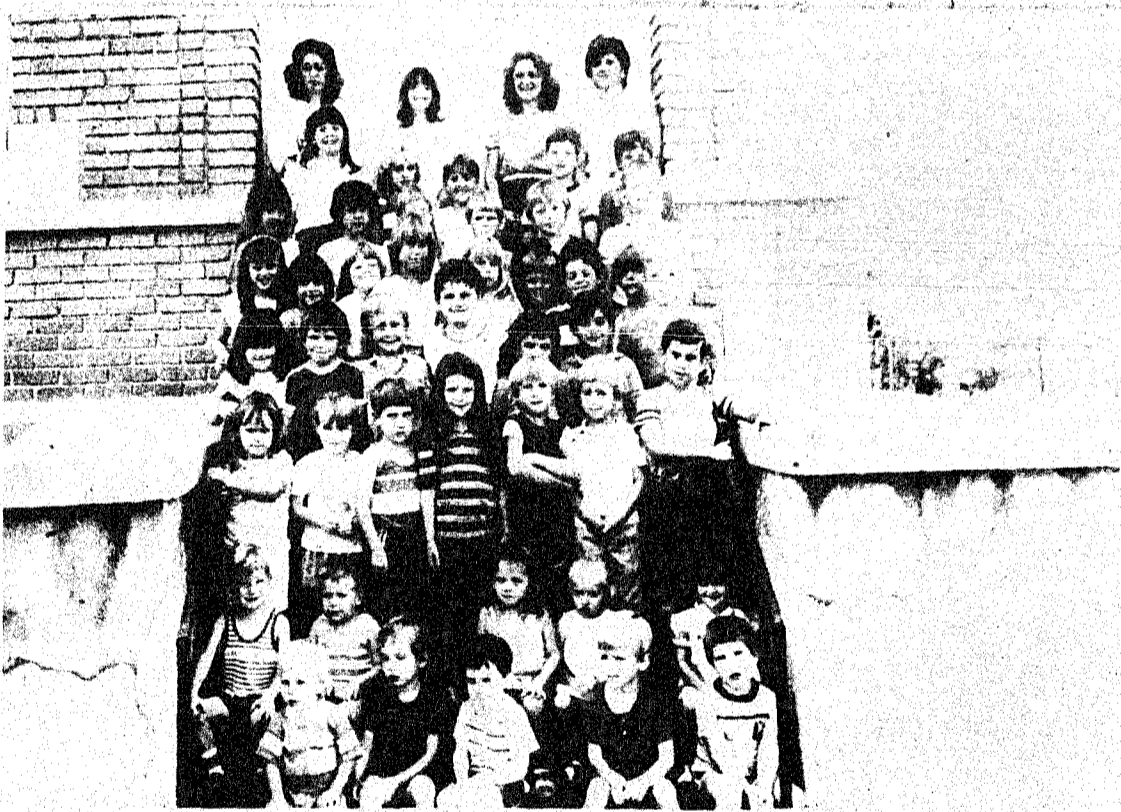
day 6:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The Wagon Wheel offers a Special on a Fish Fry every Friday evening.

During remodeling work done on the building, the owners found a mural painted on one entire wall. The wall had been painted by Corporal Loyd Aberman in August 1943 before the building was purchased by Mrs. Erin Day and moved to Santa Anna from the Camp Bowie area in Brownwood. The painting was covered by sheetrock around 1948 and left covered up until the Williams removed the sheetrock to find the painting.

Free ice cream will be served.

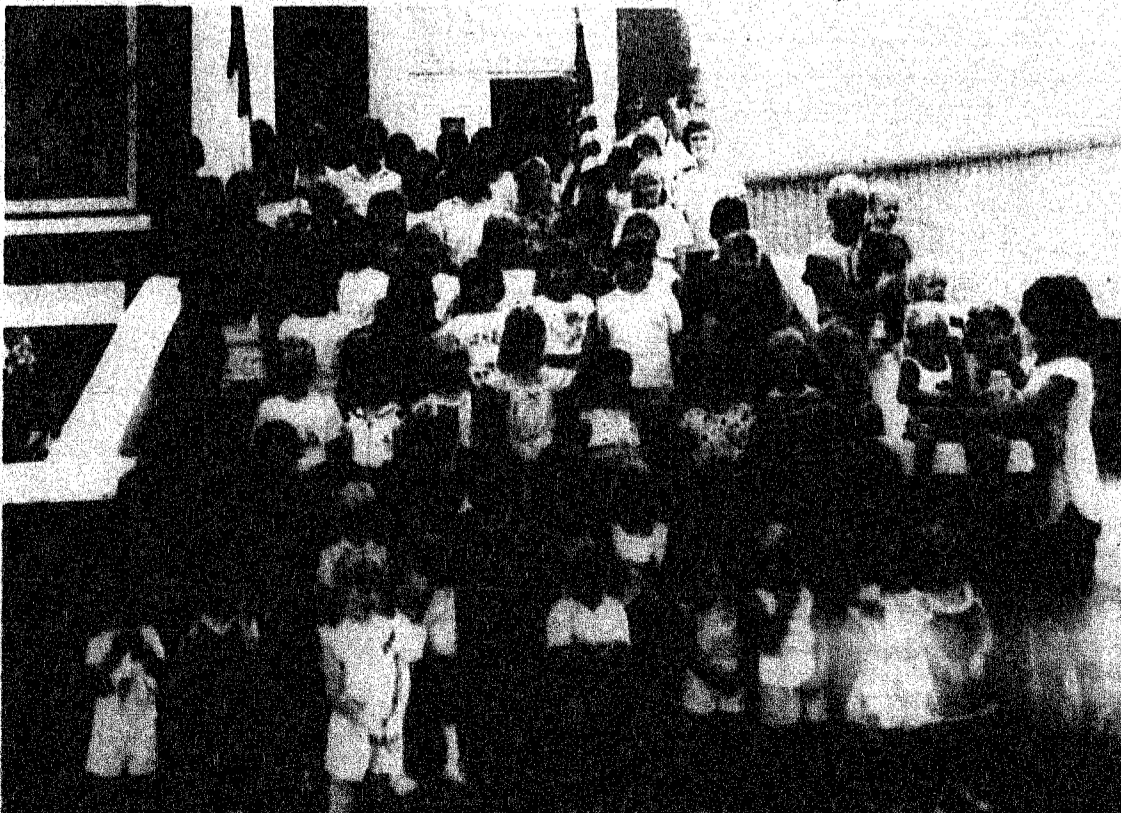


These children are attending the Vacation Bible School that is being held this week at the First United Methodist Church. Children between the ages of 2 and 12 are invited to attend.

Texans To Get Multi-Million Dollar Tax Break

AUSTIN—State Comptroller Bob Bullock recently said Texans will get a multi-million dollar tax break because of a Senate vote on the federal tax overhaul bill that will permit partial deduction of state sales tax.

Bullock said the sales tax amendment, co-sponsored by Texas Sen. Phil Gramm and supported by Texas Sen. Lloyd Bentsen, would let Texas taxpayers deduct 60 percent of their state and local taxes in figuring federal income taxes.

"The sales tax provision will save Texans who use this deduction at least \$112 million. Anytime we don't have to send over \$100 million to Washington, it's good news," Bullock said.

Bullock said Gramm's amendment was especially beneficial to Texas because the tax reform bill pending in the U.S. Senate originally allowed deductions for state and local income taxes.

"We were being penalized because we didn't have a state income tax despite the fact that we don't want an income tax," Bullock said.

Bullock said the amendment would save a deduction worth more

than \$270 to the average Texas taxpayer who files an itemized return.

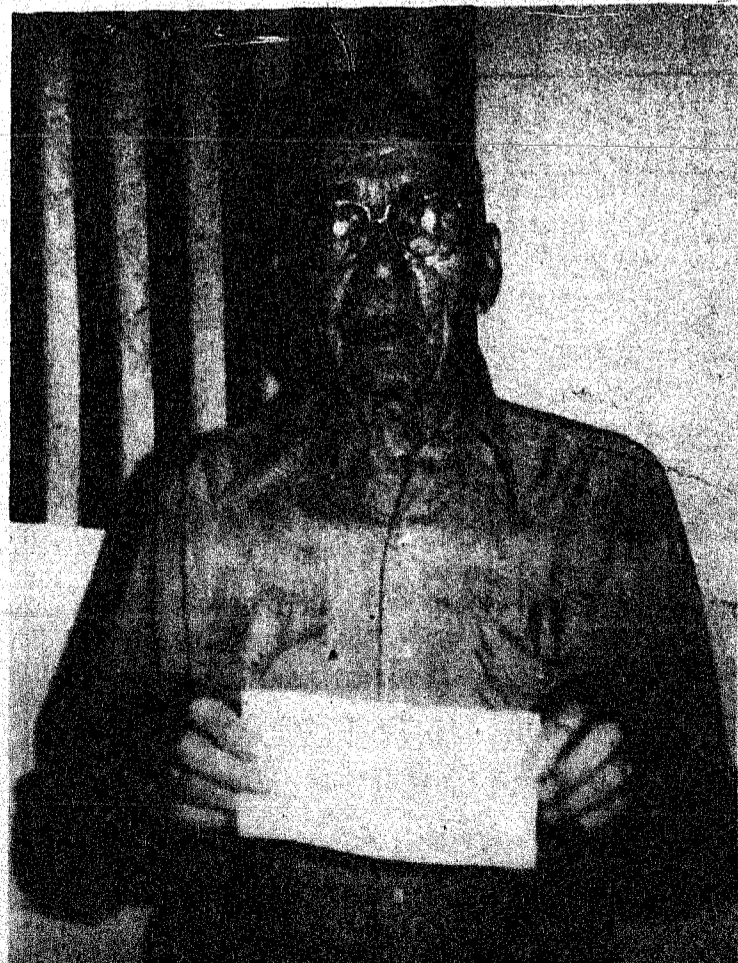
He said that Texans claimed an average of \$449 in sales tax deductions in 1984 and the 60 percent rule would preserve most of that deduction.

According to Bullock, about 27 percent of Texas taxpayers itemize

on federal returns so the amendment allowing sales tax deductions will affect more than one-in-four taxpayers.

Coleman County Telephone Cooperative hereby gives notice it has filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas for authority to change certain rates. The changes are proposed to become effective on May 25, 1986 and will affect most of the approximately 1700 customers of the company.

Most of the changes proposed are to delete services no longer provided, to unbundle service connection charges and to eliminate monthly charges for extension wiring. Within this filing the Cooperative is also proposing to detariff all leased telephones and related equipment. Customers will not be immediately affected by this change except that the Commission will no longer set lease rates or other regulations for this equipment.

The proposed rates will not cause any change in revenues. Practice began this week with the first game scheduled for July 7th in Abilene. More details will be released as soon as they are available.



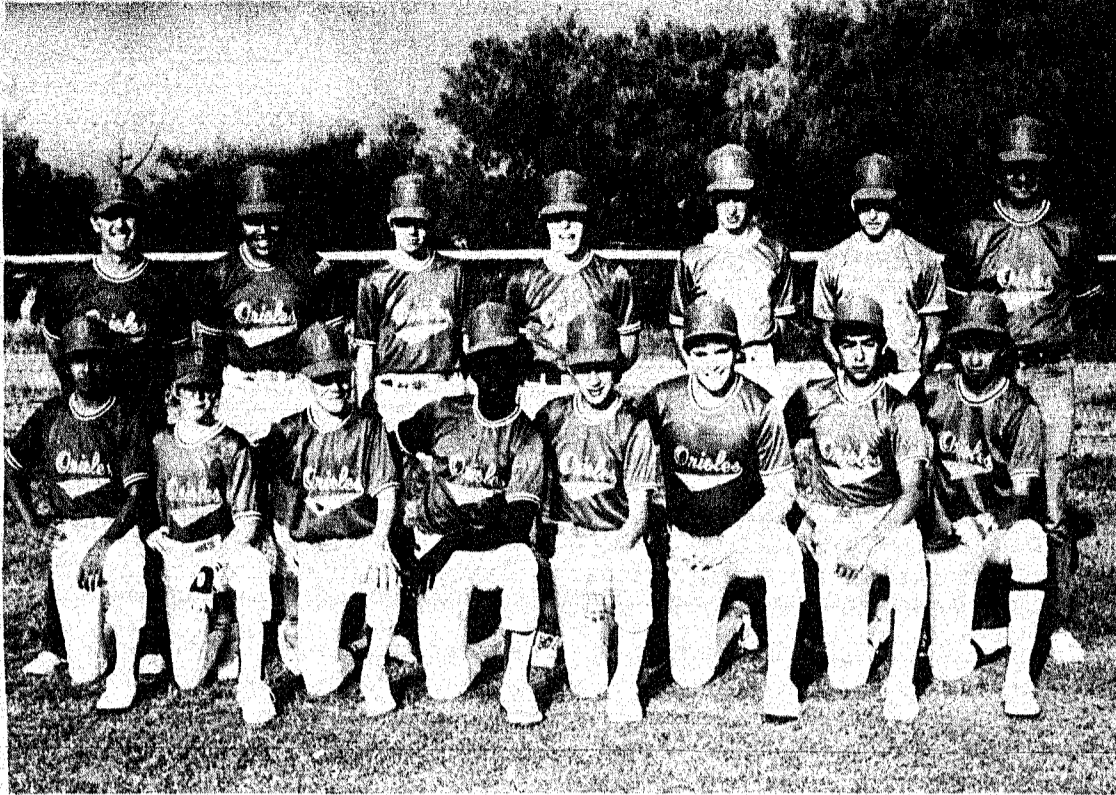

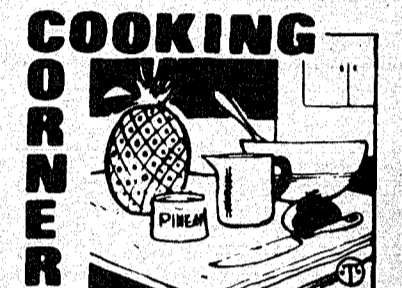

Make Your Own Ice Cream & Sauces

The hand-cranked ice cream freezer, first invented by Nancy Johnson in 1846, is the predecessor of a series of easy-to-use ice cream makers available today. Ice, once cut in blocks from frozen ponds and rivers and stored for summer use, has been replaced by ice cubes from the freezer or a frozen insert. Table salt or no salt at all have replaced rock salt, formerly needed to make the mixture freeze faster.

So today it is easy to make your own ice cream to be enjoyed immediately or after a few hours of ripening. This recipe for French Vanilla Ice Cream will be a favorite.

French Vanilla, by definition, includes eggs in the mix. This recipe also requires light cream (half and half can be used when light cream is not available), sugar and vanilla. The mix is cooked and cooled in advance. You'll have five cups of mixture; be sure to check the capacity of the ice cream maker to determine how much to freeze at a time.

American Dairy Association has developed two special sauces you'll enjoy on French Vanilla and other ice creams. Top them with Mocha Whipped Cream, made by adding cocoa and instant coffee to the cream before it is whipped.

Isn't it great to be able to make ice cream whenever you want it without having to recruit a series of

crankers for the freezer! Try these recipes next time you hunger for homemade ice cream.

FRENCH VANILLA ICE CREAM

Yield: approx. 5 cups

- 3 egg whites
- 1 cup sugar
- 3 egg yolks
- 4 cups light cream OR half and half
- 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract

Beat egg whites in a large mixing bowl until foamy; gradually add 1/2 cup sugar and continue beating until stiff peaks form. Beat egg yolks in small mixing bowl until thick and lemon colored. Add remaining 1/2 cup sugar and beat until sugar is dissolved. Fold egg yolks into egg whites; gradually stir in cream. Place mixture in a large saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until thickened, about 12 minutes. Do not boil. Stir in vanilla. Chill thoroughly. Freeze in ice cream freezer according to manufacturer's directions.

Beat together cream, sugar, cocoa and coffee in a small, chilled mixing bowl until stiff.

ORANGE-ALMOND SAUCE

Yield: 1 1/4 cups

- 1/4 cup toasted slivered almonds

Combine sugar and cornstarch in a 1-quart saucepan; gradually mix in orange juice, then marmalade. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until thickened. Cook 2 additional minutes. Remove from heat; add butter and stir until melted. Chill. Just before serving add almonds.
