Fredericksburg became the "White Path" of peace usually talked about in treaty negotiations but seldom actualized. The friendship started in January of 1847 when John O. Muesenbach and 40 German men went courageously into Comanche territory and made a treaty with Santa Anna's band. The "Easter Fires of Fredericksburg" commemorate this event annually.

Mopechucope (Old Owl), Santanna (Santa Anna), and Buffalo Hump were documented. This information will be shared in articles throughout the month of January.

One of the most remarkable aspects of the "talks" is that they were consistent with the actions which followed. The Germans and the Comanches treated each other as good neighbors.




## Virgie Lee Taylor


## Local 4-Her's **Attend Career** Day at A&M


I ask the members of Northside Baptist Church and the community for their forgiveness for any hurt I may have caused in my bad decision about the use of the church facilities for a funeral.


