Q. WHAT ARE CASHIER'S CHECKS? A. A Cashier's or Bank Check is one which you ask us to draw upon our bank, not on your account. You then pay us the amount of the check or have us deduct it from your account. It is used where you do not wish to carry cash and feel that this type on check will be more acceptable than your own.
