Why Do We Have Christmas?

It is now the season of Christmas, 1.959 years since the Prince of Peace was born in the Fulfillment of Prophecy, to reject a crown of gold and life of splendor for 33 dedicated years and a crown of thorns.

Because He came as a leader and teacher of men, there were those who devoted unceasing efforts to degrade and destroy Him. Yet, in quiet, God-like manner, He walked in the valley of men, teaching the fundamental principles of life and truth by both parable and example.

Because He lifted the eyes of mankind above the meaningless values of worldly power and earthly riches. He sinned against plunders and tyrants, and for this He was crucified.

Because He called out in pain for the forgivness of those who had tortured Him and nailed His body to a cross between two thieves, He set the highest example of the Golden Rule.

Because He came, with Divine direction, to lead mankind unto salvation, He is with us, always.

Because of His example and sacrifice, the tyrants and plunders who seek to conquer and enslave are eventually set aside and relegated to oblivion ... while the lessons of His Divine teachings remain forever, showing the way toward peace on earth, good will to men.

Because He is always with us, it is fitting that we observe the Christmas, the anniversary of His birth, in the hope that on this new Christmas the hearts of men everywhere will open up to recelve His most wondrous message.

What About After Christmas?

What happens the day after Christmas?

Is the spirit of Christmas "spent" in lavish preparation and anticipation, enjoyed but briefly, then thrown aside with the wrapping paper and colored ribbon?"

What happens the day after Christmas?

Does one breathe a deep sigh and inwardly say, "I'm glad that list to only 63 names. What we it's over for another year"?

If this happens, then certainly we are not "keeping the Christmas." The Spirit of Christmas is superficial. Our Christmas symbols and ornaments, many of them pagan in their origin, are only decorative trappings for creating a festive spirit.

It Is Real

But Christmas is not superficial. Christmas is REAL. And so must observance of the holiday be REAL and not the mere matter of observing customs and practices as a matter of conformity.

The glitter is gone from evergreens and holly wreaths on the day after Christmas. The tree suddenly becomes old and drops its needles upon the carpet. No longer does the bright figure of Santa adorn the mantle or doorway; it simply hangs there, bereft of glamcur and stirring little anticipation.

It Has Meaning


Austin — The Texas Highway Department has just totaled its forty-first year of operation. State Highway Engineer D. C. Greer said that 80 percent of the funds expended during the past year were for construction, and 13 percent for maintenance. "Less than two-thirds of one percent was spent for the ad-ministration of the Highway De-

ministration of the Highway Deministration of the Highway De-partment, and the remaining six and one-third percent went for the highway patrol and mis-cellaneous operations. cellaneous operations.

"The 80 percent expended for construction is the largest per-cent that has gone for this item since the few-years soon after the creation of the Highway Department. Almost all of the ex-CEEEE penditures went for constructon in those early days, as the counties were responsible for highway maintenance \mathbf{at}_{t} that time. The Department assumed, mantenance of state highways in 1924.

Common Sense Driving Should Be Observed

Faced with what is expected to become one of the most deadly Christmas-New Year's holidays in several years trafficwise, the Texas Department of Public Safety is readying its forces for the sudden surge Wednesday of yuletide driving. Col. Homer Garrison, Jr., director of the Texas DPS, has announced that every available man, radar device and other law enforcement tools, will be used to the utmost in an effort to hold traffic accidents to a minimum. He said the department's manpower and equipment will be used to remove what he called "accident-prone" drivers from the highways.

The department last week announced its prediction of 111 persons to die in traffic accidents during the 12-day period extending from 12:01 a. m Dec. 23 through 11:59 p.m. Jan 3. The department will again this year conduct its Operation Deathwatch during this holiday

period counting all violent deaths in Texas. A prediction by Department Statistician N Woerner indicated that a total of 200 persons will be killed, including 47 homicides and suicides and 42 other accidental deaths.

The DPS traffic law enforce-ment plans announced by Garrison include the transferring of License and Weight Patrolmen and Motor Vehicle Inspection Patrolmen to highway patrol duties for the holiday period to bolster the force of the Texas Highway Patrol. The men Texas Highway Patrol. The men have been assigned certain seg-ments of highways to patrol with instructions to aid motor-ists in distress, to help tourists, and above all to take necessary action against all drivers who speed, commit right-of-way vio-lations, drive while drinking, or violate the laws of safe driving in any other way

in any other way. Garrison called upon drivers to do all within their power to make their holiday trips safe 🚒 and pleasant.

"Each driver is his own best protector. Every person who gets behind the wheel of an automo-bile must stay constantly alert to avoid situations that lead to traffic accidents. Texans, aided by thousands of out-of-state drivers, will crowd our streets and highways. "Law enforcement officers on all levels of government will be working around the clock throughout the period to do all 'Each driver is his own best

throughout the period to do all within their power to stop the bad driver before he becomes involved in a traffic mishap. But law enforcement cannot be at every street intersection, at and night.





Practically every nation has its special Christmas dish, and since American's represent people from all parts of the world it is not surprising that one finds different holiday menus in the various parts of our country. Two menu headlines, however, have thoroughly American pedi-grees...turkey and cranberries.

Indians ate wild turkey, cranberries, and pumpkins before the first European colonists arrived The turkey on present-day holiday tables is a domesticated varlety of the native wild turkey Though thoroughly American the bird acquired a name indicaing foreign origin it is believed this happened because the gob-bler was mistakenly identified with the guinea cock, a bird imported from Africa by way of Turkey.

Among other foods on the holiday table, olives and celery are foreign-born. Celery first made its appearance in France in the 17th century. Olives probably originated in the region extending from Syria to Greece. Potatoes, corn, lima beans, tomatoes, sweet potaloes, squash and garden peppers claim to be American born and breed - but most of them first grew in South América, rather than States Bar North America

Bethlehem Observes Three Christmases

This year, as usual, pilgrims from all over the world will wor-ship in the little town of Bethlehem, the holiest spot of Christendom, Visitors will worship in the grotto where Christ was born and in the towering Basilica of the Nativity built during the sixth century by Emperor Justinian.

Yet the residents of Bethlehem, which has a far greater population than it had some 2,000 years ago, will celebrate three Christmases, rather than one

The western church keeps December 25 holy. The Greek Orthodox Church keeps the Christmas according to the Georgian calendar, on Jan. 7 and the Armenians observe January 19.

The Greek Orthodox Church and the Armenians share the Basilica, the Roman Catholics use their own church adjoining — but all three share the grotto, where, traditionally, during the early hours of December 25 a tiny statue of Jesus is wraped in swaddling clothes and laid in the manger.

During the Middle Ages, Epi-phany, or Twelfth Night, was commemorated with plays presented in churches. Solemn observances largely disappeared in Elizabethan England, and they became a time for revelry.

Shakespear's "Twelfth Night" réflects this mood. It was probably presented in a command performance at Whitehall Palace on January 6, 1601, according to historians

Today child "kings" crowned with golden paper coronets roam the streets of Europe on Epip-hany, singing hymns and carols. In Italy, millions of children a-wake to find their stockings filled with presents from La Befana, the good-hearted witch who takes the place of Santa Claus.

Custom In France, a portion of the Epiphany cake is often set a-side as "la part de Dieu"—God's share. It is given to the first poor person who comes to the door

In Greece, three pieces of cake are cut: one for Christ, one for Mary, and one for St. Basil. In Britian, Tweifth Night cake is washed down with Lamb's Wool, a drink made with hot, strong ale spiced with nutmeg and sugar

FIRST LIGHTED TREE

The first electrically lighted Christmas tree in this country is believed to have been the one placed in the lobby of San Fran-cisco's Palace Hotel in 1896. 
