- 1 cup shortening (half butter)
- 2 cups sugar 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 1 teaspoon almond extract 1/2 teaspoon lemon extract
- 4 cups sifted flour 2 teaspoons baking powder 1.1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1.1/2 cups diced citron 1.1/2 cups flaked coconut 1/2 cup water 1/2 cup sherry or pineapple

1 cup slivered blanched Cream shortening, sugar and flavorings together until very light and fluffy. Resift flour with baking powder and salt. Add to creamed mixture alternately with water and sherry. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Fold in remaining ingredients until well blended. Spoon batter into 2 well-greased and floured 1-1/2 to 2-quart molds, filling to within ½ inch of top edge. Bake in slow oven (300 degrees F.) for 1-1/2 to 3 hours depending on size of cake. Pick inserted in center of cake will come out clean when cake is baked. Remove baked cakes from oven. Let stand in pan's about 20 minutes before turning out on wire racks to cool. When thoroughly cold, wrap in foil and store in cool place to mellow before cutting, at least 3 to 4 days. Makes about 3-1/2 quarts batter.


