been less than the previous year. According to Col.
Wilson E Speir, drrector of the Department of Public
Safety, the increase in 1971 was less than 1970 and
1970 was less than the increase in 1969 . However, up
to that time there had been an increase almost every
year since 1961 .
Based on population, the crime rate still dropped
2.6 per cent over the previous year. Oddly enough, the only crime that did ont increase in Texas during the year was thefts which dropped
by about 11 per cent. Otherwise most all other crimes were up with murder up 15 per cent, rape up nearly
