

April Date Set For Man Charged With Possession

An April 4 trial date has been set by Dist. Judge Joe Dibrell for James Clifford Moore, 32, of Balmorhea, who is charged with possession of marijuana. The trial will be held in Coleman after Judge Dibrell Monday overruled a motion for a change of venue. Moore was arrested after Coleman County sheriff's officers and FBI agents found three-quarters of an acre of marijuana under cultivation, near Burkett in northeast Coleman Co. The marijuana which weighed about a ton, was valued by law enforcement officers at \$275,000.

Dibrell's ruling on the change of venue came after the defense had called six witnesses and the state called five.

Milton Autry, publisher of the Coleman paper, told Judge Dibrell that Coleman has not had a bigger story for the last five years, but had no opinion on the prejudice the community might have drawn from the publicity.

Bob Pierson, a soil conservationist who has lived and worked in Coleman the past six years, said it would be "most difficult to get a fair and impartial jury" in Coleman.

Weldon Davis, a Coleman banker and rancher, said he has talked with many persons in Coleman and said there would be no prejudice whatsoever.

Bill Bennett, a hardware salesman, said he agreed that Moore could get a fair trial. "Publicity never hurt anyone. No matter what the publicity on what case, I still wouldn't be prejudiced."

Charles Scarborough of Abilene represented Moore, while 35th District Attorney George Day of Brownwood represented the state.


