
Rockwood Boy At Stock Show





I graduated from Early High School in 1950, and received by **B.S. Degree from Howard Payne** College in 1954.


Immediately after graduation, I entered the U.S. Army and after spending two years in the service I received an honorable discharge in 1956.

four-steer average.


Rites Held For Miss Bertie Box At Rockwood
