Liz Morris Wins Again; Breaks Own State Record

Elizabeth Morris, State Class B track winner in 1975, trimmed one-tenth second off her last year's record and took a championship in the 1976 State track meet in Austin last Saturday. Elizabeth ran the 440 yard dash in 56.8 seconds to win the gold medal and set a new track record in Class B.

The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Marion (Boots) Morris, Elizabeth is a senior student at SAHS where she has been active in athletics all through junior high and high school. She was an all-district selection as basketball forward, two years, averaging 20 points per game the past season. Called "Liz" by family and friends, Miss Morris served as a cheerleader the past year and was drum major of the band as a junior. She is a member of the band and stage band, playing flute. She is also a member of Librarians Club. She plans to attend college this fall and would like to participate in collegiate athletics.

Elizabeth credits part of her success to the encouragement and help of her family, friends,

coaches and teachers. Her second trip to the State Track Meet was just as exciting as the first time, Liz said, and maintaining her record was more important during her last year in high school.

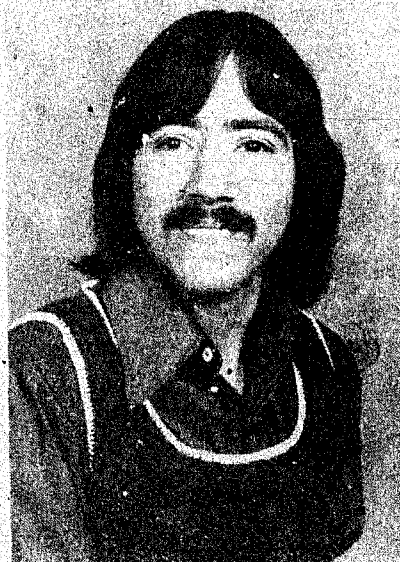
Janera Naron Places Second In State UIL

PAVING PROJECT COMPLETED; 40 BLOCKS NEW, RESURFACED

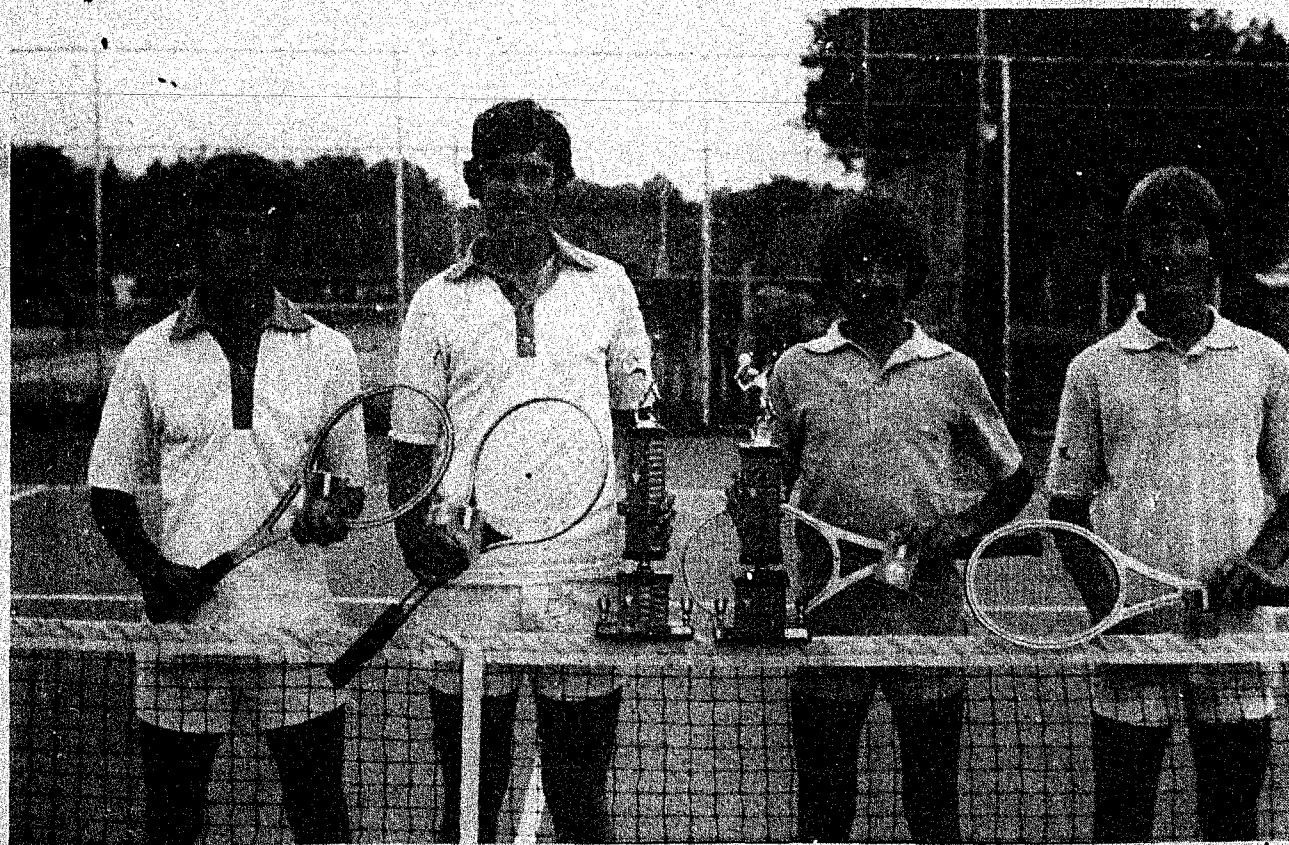
One of the most extensive programs of street improvement in Santa Anna has been completed this week with paving and resurfacing of about 40 blocks in town. The project was funded by a Community Development Grant for which application was made over a year ago.

Included in the project was paving of about 20 blocks

including the South Houston and South Lee area that is a new housing development, and several blocks along South Jefferson, Fifth, Sixth and Seventh Streets.

Avenue A and B were resurfaced during the week. J. D. Welch Construction Co., was contractor for the job.

Work is also planned by both the sewer and water departments under the same Federal grant.

Local Author Has First Novel; Story of Missionary to Burma

Leola Christie Barnes of Santa Anna has recently published her sixth book, "Home Address Paradise" by Vantage Press of New York. The book is the first novel for the author whose other works include four books of

verse, "Crimson Dawning," "Purple Petals," "Silver Century," and "West to Glory," and an autobiography of the late Maria Magnon, "Her Majesty Nevertheless."

Leola Christie Barnes always loved Kipling's song, "On the Road to Mandalay" but never dreamed that one day she would be on the other side of the world in the bizarre Buddhist land of Burma. However a few years ago on a trip around the world she visited several weeks with her daughter and husband, Terry and Beth Sanders, in the American Embassy in Rangoon where she learned more about the sweet and friendly people of that country. She was flowing over with the strange things and people she met there and interested in the history back in the 1800s.

Mrs. Barnes felt compelled to write a book that would acquaint the world with the little known land, and feeling the leadership of God, the story of an early-day missionary to Burma literally poured from her heart.

A dedicated Christian, Mrs.

Barnes has taught Sunday School at First Baptist Church for around sixty years. She holds two degrees from Daniel Baker College and has been honored by being named a Fellow in the Royal Society of Arts and Sciences in Great Britain and an honorary member of the Eugene Field Society of St. Louis. She was also awarded an honorary degree of Literature from a Washington University.

The 245-page book is available from Vantage Press or from the author, Box 125, Santa Anna.
