

Work is also planned by both the Included in the project was sewer and water departments paving of about 20 blocks, under the same Federal grant.


## Liz Morris Wins Again; **Breaks Own State Record**

The junior high, high school, and stage bands will perform, and there will also be selections by the combined groups. 😘


