

S-ANNA YOUTH LOSES LIFE IN DROWNING MISHAP SUNDAY

Tragedy struck the community Sunday afternoon when a Santa Anna eighth grade student, Clarence Baker drowned in a stock tank at the Gene Boiven ranch seven miles northeast of Santa Anna. The accident occurred about 5:30 p.m. as young Baker and his brother, Joseph, and a friend, Wayne Kuykendall, were near Baker's father at another tank.

According to Justice of the Peace Walter Holt of Coleman, the death was accidental. Santa Anna firemen pulled the body from the tank about 6:30 p.m. where he ws pronounced dead. The boy did not know how to swim and apparently stepped into a hole of water six or seven feet deep. Rescue attemps by those at the scene failed.

Born January 10, 1962 in Antioch, California, Clarence was the son of Mr. and Mrs. M. D. (Bunk) Baker. The family moved to Santa Anna in 1962. He was a member of First Christian Church.

Funeral services were held at First Christian Church Wednesday, March 3, with the pastor, Rev. Anthony Thibedeaux,





year with 975 members. All 210 county Farm Bureaus will be seeking to show a gain in membership for the fourth year in a row.


