Santa Anna Is More Than Just a
Mountain (The logo of the Chamber
of Commerce since the early 1940's).
On Austin's map of 1835 it was

noted as "Migh Peak". It is not known when the twin hills were named Santa Anna Peaks. The name was honoring a Comanche Chief, Santana, who was in power in the
1040 's and was friendly to the 1440's and
Texans.
In 1845 the Chief visited President
James Polk in Washinton D.C., dur-
ing the United States negotiations to
annex Tezas, and signed a Peace
Treaty which he kept until his death
in 1899 .

by early explorers, the United Sates
