Santa Anna ISD Offers Quality Education


#### Abstract

Each year all school districts and canpuses are ranked according to the previous years scores on the Texas Educational Assessment of Minimum Skills (TEAMS) Minimum Skills (TEAMS). The Texas Education Agency uses this information to target and assist those schools in the lower 5 and 25 percent. The ranking for the Santa Anna ISD was received by Superintendent Gerald Brister last week. The Santa Anna Elementary

People applying for or receiving
supplemental income (SSI) payments, or who live with someone. who does, should be familiar with the effect living arangements can
have on their benefits. Because living arrangements can make a dif ference in a person's income; they may affect the amount of payment a person can get.
SSI paynent
with little or no income and with little or no income and
resources, who are 65 or over, blind,
or disabled or disabled. Currently over 4 million people are receiving SSI benifits na-
tionwide. The basic Federal tionwide. The basic Federal pay-
ment is $\$ 340$ for eligible individuals ment is $\$ 340$ for eligible individuals
and is $\$ 510$ for eligible couples living together. This payment may be

lives in the household of another is reduced by one-third. The reduction is required because the room and the person getting the SSI helps to meet his or her basic needs. Exceptions are made in cases where the person is paying a
fixed amount for room and board or pays his or her share of total household orpenses. In either situation the SSI payment is not reduced. Any change in living arrangements should be reported to
the Social Security office in the Social Security office im-
mediately, since it can effect the mediately, since it can effect the
payment a person is recelving. If a person moves out of the household ot nother, the monthly payment may go up. If he or she moves into the
household of another while receiving payment, the payment may be reduced, Fallure to report im mediately could lead to overpay--
ment or underpayment of benefits. Overpayments must be repaid; in most cases this is accomplished by deductions from future checks. However, if fraud or deliberate concealment of the facts occurs, a perso nay recelve penalties ranging
if a fine to a jail term. People who have questions about how their living arrangement affect
their SSI payments should call their Social Security office and let us Social Security office and let us
