Md., Douglass escaped the bonds of slavery in 1838 , changed his name and began a new life in the Northeast. Having leamed to read secretly as a boy, Douglass developed a literary
brilliance and oratorical style brilliance and oratorical style thal
cataputed him into the forefront of the abolition movement. His speeches on the dehumanizing effects of slavery led to his new career in chusetts Anti-Slavery Society Massachusetts Anti-Slavery Society. Later, his autobiography, "Life'and TGimes of Frederick Douglass,":completed
Douglass was the first black citizen o hold high rank in the U.S. govem consultant to President Abraham Lincoln, and later fought for full civil
