



## Thoughts From Our Pastors

Linwood E. Bishop Northside Church of Christ

#### THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE CROSS

It can not be successfully denied that the one who later became Jesus the Christ was "in the beginning with God". That He was co-existent with and shared in the glory, majesty and divinity of God (John 1:1-12). The divinely inspired writer of Hebrews records this..."God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in times past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto us by His Son, whom he hath appointed heir to all things, by whom also he hath made the worlds: who being the brightness of his glory, AND THE EX-PRESS IMAGE OF HIS PERSON (Emp. mine LEB), and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high" (Hebrews 1:1-3). These and other scriptures make it crystal clear that our Saviour was a deity before he became human. But thank God, he was willing to give up his glory and divinity, and his equality with God in order to become saviour of the world.

The Holy Spirit inspired Paul to record this..."Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God; But made himself no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: and being found in the fashion as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and hath given him a name which is above every name. That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in the heaven, and things in the earth, and things under the earth.; and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2:5-11).

The son of God willingly offered himself as the "Lamb of God" who was to take away the sin of the world. (John 1:29). He was the fulfillment of every sacrificial lamb offered under the old Testament from Abel to the day of his own death on the cross. The animal sacrifices offered under the Old Testament were only typical and could never take away sins. It took the blood of Jesus Christ to do that. (See Hebrews

Jesus Knew from the beginning what death he should die. He said, "And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me. This he said, signifying what death he should die." (John 12:32-33).

Jesus willingly laid down his life to save others, because that was the only way that God could be both just and a justifier of those who believe in Jesus (Romans 3:26). The cross is the drawing power of Jesus. His suffering an agony on the cross is a demonstration of his great love for lost humanity (John 10:17-18). The Dorcas Sunday School Class

When man was without strength or power or means to save himself, Jesus volunteered to die for him (Romans 5:6). And again God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8).

The suffering of Jesus perfected him as our saviour and our High Priest (Hebrews 1:10-11, 14-18, 4:14-16 and Hebrews 5:8-9). As we behold the manifestation of the great love of God as portrayed in the suffering of his Son on the Cross, we are drawn to him by the power of faithful obedience to his will and way. 
**Word Of Caution From Youngster Bitten By Dog**
