### Santa By Any Other Name...is The Same

Whether it's Santa Claus who fills your stockings, or Kris Kringle, Pore Noel, or St. Nicholas, there's probably a lot about that "jolly old elf" that might surprise you.

For instance, the original Santa Claus is believed to have been a bishop in what is now Turkey in the fourth century. Generous and wealthy, he is said to have secretly given bags of gold to poor children.

He got his "checks like a rose, his nose like a cherry," and the names of his eight tiny reindeer" from Clement Moore, a noted biblical scholar who wrote A Visit From St. Nicholas (beginning "Twas the night before Christmas...") in 1822. Famous cartoonist Thomas Nast drew the red suit and white beard we know today.

## Jackson Gets All-State Honors

A running back that stacked up staggering statistics and a defensive back that covered the field from sideline to sideline are Central Texas' representatives on the Associated Press Sports Editors Class A All-State football team announced Sunday.

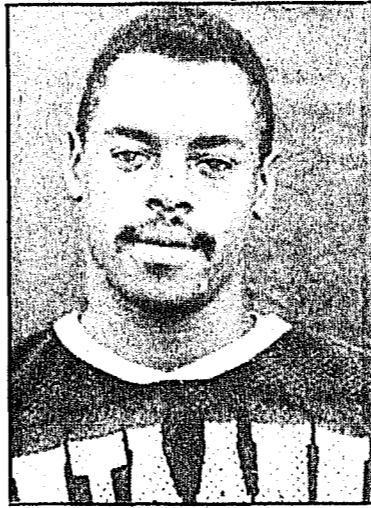
Santa Anna running back Herbert Jackson rushed for 2,038 yards and 22 touchdowns in leading Coach Mike Permenter's Mountaineers into the Class A playoffs.

As far as Santa Anna school coaches and officials can determine, Jackson is the first football player from SAHS to ever be named for all-state honors. Jackson is a senior at Santa Anna high school and is an outstanding athlete in football, basketball, and track. He is the son of Judy Jackson.

Gorman's Stephen Scitern was named Class A defensive player of the year after receiving the most votes. The senior defensive back made 83 tackles, including 46 solos, and intercepted six passes for Gorman. He also recovered a pair of fumbles.

Offensive player of the year honors went to Bartlett receiver Johnny Walker, who caught 39 passes for 870 yards and 12 touchdowns.

Central Texans on the honorable mention list included running back-punter Donny Alcorn of Rising Star, offensive lineman Larry Hollis of Rising Star, offensive lineman-defensive lineman Justin Underwood of Gorman, quarterback Kevin Hirst of Gorman, linebacker Brandon Geyer of Rising Star, defensive back Jody Brown of Cross Plains and Jackson at linebacker.

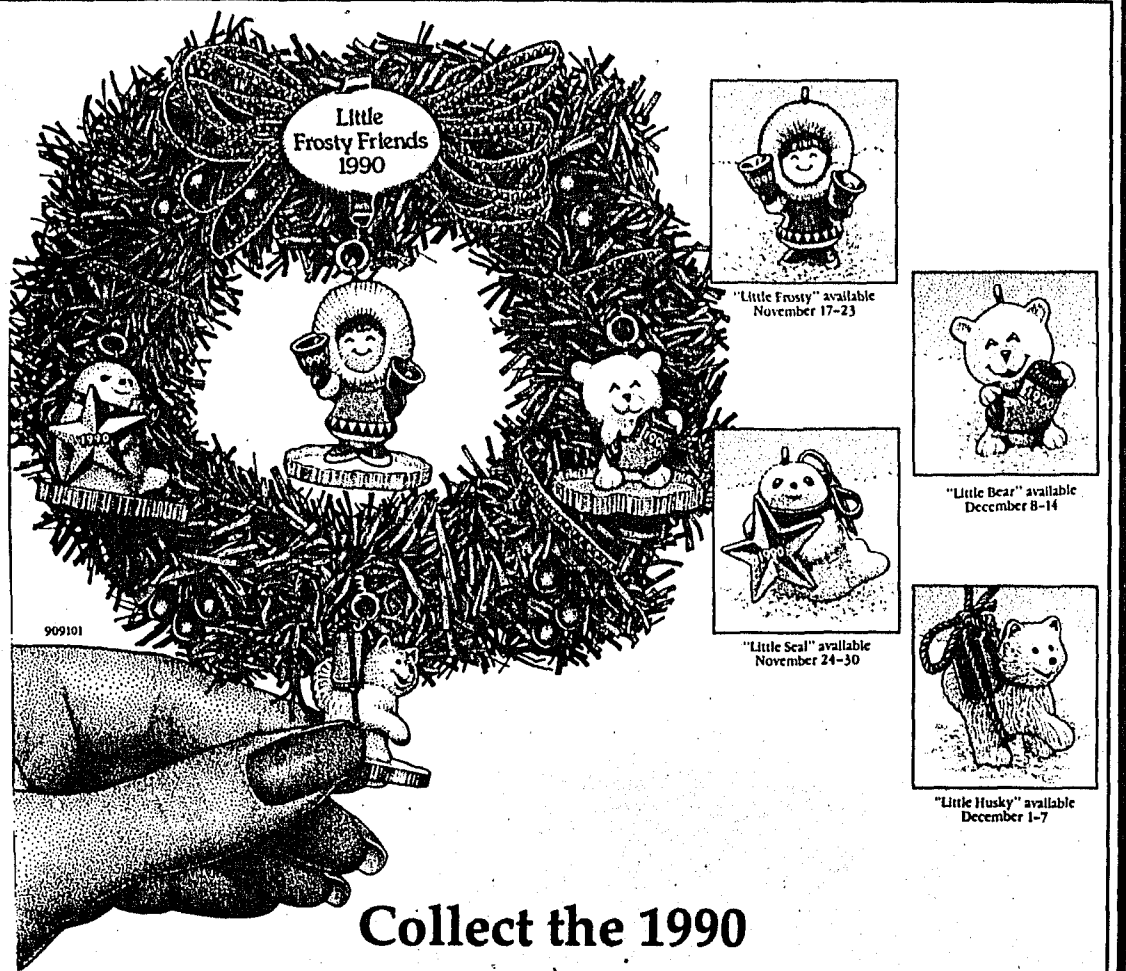

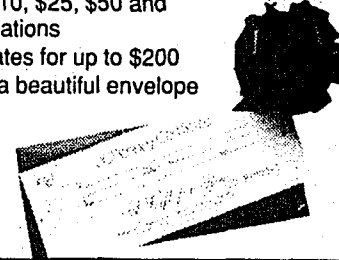

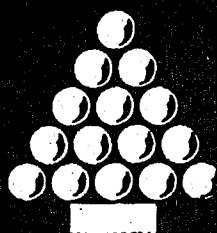

### Recent Cases Heard In District Court

The following cases were presented to the Honorable Don Lane, District Judge, on Thursday, December 13, 1990 at 2:00 p.m., reported by Felony Prosecutor Ross Jones:

1. Cause No. 381, Darral Duwayne Slayton, Possession of a Controlled Substance, a Class 3 Felony. Slayton pled guilty and was sentenced to five years confinement in the Institutional Division of the Department of Criminal Justice, probated for a term of five years, to pay a \$1,000.00 fine, court costs and probation fees of \$30.00 per month.

Slayton was sentenced to five years confinement in the Institutional Division of the Department of Criminal Justice and ordered to pay restitution in the amount of \$200.00 to the Shoppin Basket Food Center of Coleman, Texas. 3. Cause No. 408, Shawn Savage Slayton, Possession of a Forged Instrument, a Class 3 Felony. This case was dismissed as part of the plea bargain in the probation revocation pending in Cause No. 308 in the 42nd Judicial District Court of Coleman County, Texas.

The following cases were presented to the Honorable Don Lane, District Judge, on Thursday, November 15, 1990, at 2:00 p.m., reported by Felony Prosecutor Ross Jones:

1. Cause No. 384, Marty Ray Warnock, Arson, a Class 2 Felony. Warnock pled nolo contendere and was sentenced to five years confinement in the Institutional Division of the Department of Criminal Justice, probated for a term of five years, to pay a \$1,000.00 fine, court costs and probation fees of \$30.00 per month.

2. Cause No. 389, Sherry J. Dunn, Securing Execution of a Document by Deception, a Class 3 Felony. Ms. Dunn pled guilty and was sentenced to five years deferred adjudication, to pay restitution in the amount of \$3,528.61 to the Texas Department of Humari Services, court costs and court-appointed attorney fees; and the agreement for the payments to commence February 1, 1991.

3. Cause No. 138, Vicki Dawn Schwab, Motion to Revoke Probation. Ms. Schwab pled true to probation violation and was placed on surveillance probation out of the Taylor County probation office.
