## State Welfare Tab \$3,628,924 In County Last Year

According to a report received from by the Santa Anna News office on Friday of last week, the State of Texas spent a total of \$3,628,924 last year for major welfare programs in Coleman County. The report came from the

Abilene office of Ray L. Dunavant, Regional Administrator for the Texas Department of Human Services.

"Medical assistance had the biggest impact, with \$1,294,060 spent for hospitals, physicians, laboratory, X-ray and other services. Also, \$101,913 was spent in Coleman County for prescribed medicines. Nursing home costs of approximately \$1,236,669 were paid for aged and disabled residents," Dunavant said.

Food stamps worth \$811,382 were issued for the fiscal year which ended August 31, while Aide to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) totaled \$184,900. Food

stamps are funded entirely by the federal government, while the department determines eligibility of applicants and issues the food coupons.

The state and federal governments share in the cost of AFDC to families where needy children are deprived of support because of the absence or disability of one or both parents.

In addition to services and assistance to low-income residents of the county, the department extended protective services to 52 abused and neglected children and

their parents or caretakers. These services, furnished without regard to family income, were designed to

reduce or eliminate danger to children.

There were 52 investigations in adult protective services. These investigations concerned reports of abuse, neglect, or exploitation of elderly or disabled adults.

### French Woman 116 Years Of Age

Last week we printed a picture of Clarinda Menges who had recently marked her 103rd birthday. A longtime Santa Anna area resident, Mrs. Menges now makes her home at Ranger Park Inn. She is a remarkable woman who grew up near Harper, Texas and moved to the Santa Anna area in 1907 as the bride of the late Edmund Menges. The couple raised two sons, Charlie (Dude) and Earl, both now deceased. Her husband passed away in 1970.

She attributes her longevity to a "happy marriage and good life on the farm." According to a niece, Dorothy Alsobrook, "Aunt Clarinda just loved farm life." She is doing quite well, thank you, in spite of a recent setback and hospital stay. She goes anywhere in the Inn that she wants to, maneuvering her own wheelchair. She can walk if allowed, but since a recent fall is watched carefully when attempting to do so.

Her health is really quite good and her outlook is inspiring.

There is, however, a woman in France whose memories stretch further back than Clarinda's, probably further than anyone else's in the world. At 116 years of age, Jeanne Calment is reportedly the oldest person in the world today.

Born in 1875, she has lived her life in Arles, France. She and her husband, Ferdinand, were married almost a century ago in 1896 and had one daughter who died of pleurisy 57 years ago. Her husband passed away eight years later.

Although she is partially deaf and can barely see, Jeanne

### 2nd Annual Coleman OLM Summer Fest Brisket & Chili Cookoff

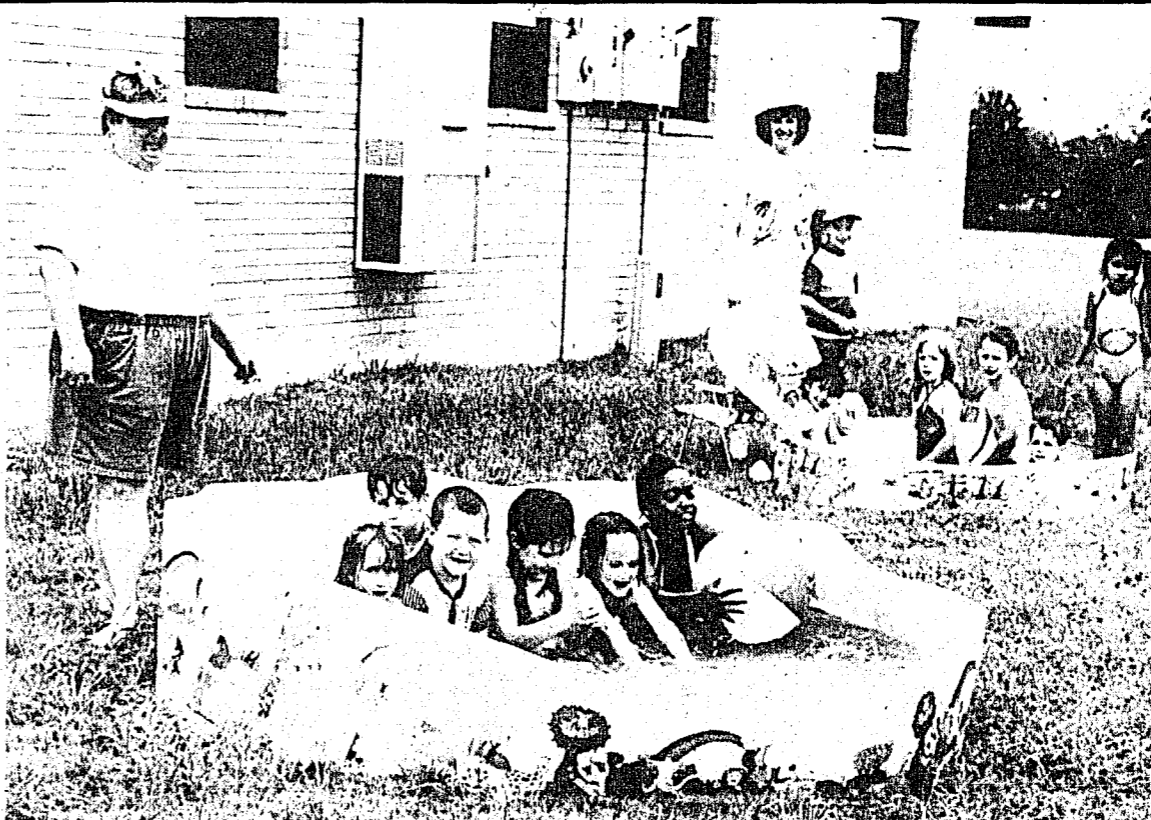

## Blanche Hamon Willis

In May, an obituary was sent to your newspaper reporting the death of our mother, Blanche Hamon Willis. She grew up and attended school in Santa Anna and was married in the Santa Anna Christian Church in 1923. There are people there who remember her and we feel there are a few facts about her life which should have been included in the obituary.

She and her husband, Clebert Willis, moved to San Diego, California in 1942, where she became the first woman bus driver for the San Diego Transit System. Her picture, with the big city bus, appeared on the cover of a national transit magazine.

She joined the Pacific Beach Christian Church and was a leader in the church for 42 years. Active in the Christian Women's Fellowship, she was selected Valiant Woman of the Year in 1978 by women from all of the churches. She was the first woman elder elected in her church and was installed in most of the offices. She did everything from washing communion cups and trays, to writing and directing plays and Christmas programs, to working with the State Board. She was a speaker in other churches for many programs involving people of other denominations. Recently, a church service was dedicated to her and a memorial fund has been set up in her honor at the church.

A talented writer, her poems and children's stories are family treasures. She was a loving and forgiving person, and the center of a close family which included 4 children, 16 grandchildren and 20 great-grandchildren. She is truly missed, not only by family, but by many friends. She earned the love and respect of all those who knew her.
