had early planted wheat alongside had early planted wheat alongside
of late planted wheat. Wheat pasures seemed to grow slowly during the fall due to lack of rain and in grazing available until the first of ebruary.
During the spring months when emperatures began to warm up, Dryland root rot, leaf and stem rust and wheat streak mosaic virus
infected wheat pastures and will potentially reduce wheat yields. The presence of these diseases also
affected growers' decisions as of affected growers' decisions as of
whether to harvest the grain, graze out, or cut for hay. Some producers have decided to cut and bale their wheat for hay. Wheat hay has a
protein content ranging from $6-8$ percent depending on fertilizer apin the hay wich with the grain content of $10-11$ percent. Wheat pastures in Coleman Coungrain with some wheat waedre of grain with some wheat yields as
