## Wheat Harvest Begins

Many farmers and ranchers around Coleman are preparing for the 1993 wheat harvest which began in the southern part of the county last week. Approximately 70,000 acres of wheat were planted this last fall, but probably only 25-40 percent of this wheat will be harvested as grain. The other 60-75 percent of wheat acreage will be grazed out by livestock or cut and baled for hay.

Several factors affected this

year's wheat crop. Environmental, economic, and disease problems plagued wheat growers throughout the season. Lack of adequate moisture last fall prevented good establishment at planting and created a situation where growers had early planted wheat alongside of late planted wheat. Wheat pastures seemed to grow slowly during the fall due to lack of rain and in some areas, there was very little grazing available until the first of February.

### District Court Presented With Number Of Cases In Coleman Recently

TIP is a non-profit educational organization established in 1980 with a five-year grant from the Duke Endowment. The program received continuing support from student fees, individuals, corporations and foundations. TIP identifies approximately 60,000 seventh graders from 16 states in the Southeast, Midwest and Southwest annually, who are mathematically and verbally gifted.

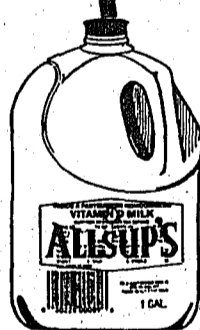
