Senate Clears Coleman County District Attorney Bill

AUSTIN—The Texas Senate, on Sunday, approved a bill that would, for the first time, provide Coleman County with its own District Attorney. HB 12 includes an amendment sponsored by Senator Temple Dickson, calling for the new position.

"Coleman County has needed its own district attorney for some time," said Dickson. "Rural Texas has not escaped the statewide trend of increasing crime and the need for more effective law enforcement. This bill will enable the county to hire a district attorney who can focus on

the job of prosecuting criminals."

Currently, Coleman County relies on a part-time felony prosecutor who is also Assistant County Attorney. Ross Jones has served as Coleman County Felony Prosecutor since 1987.

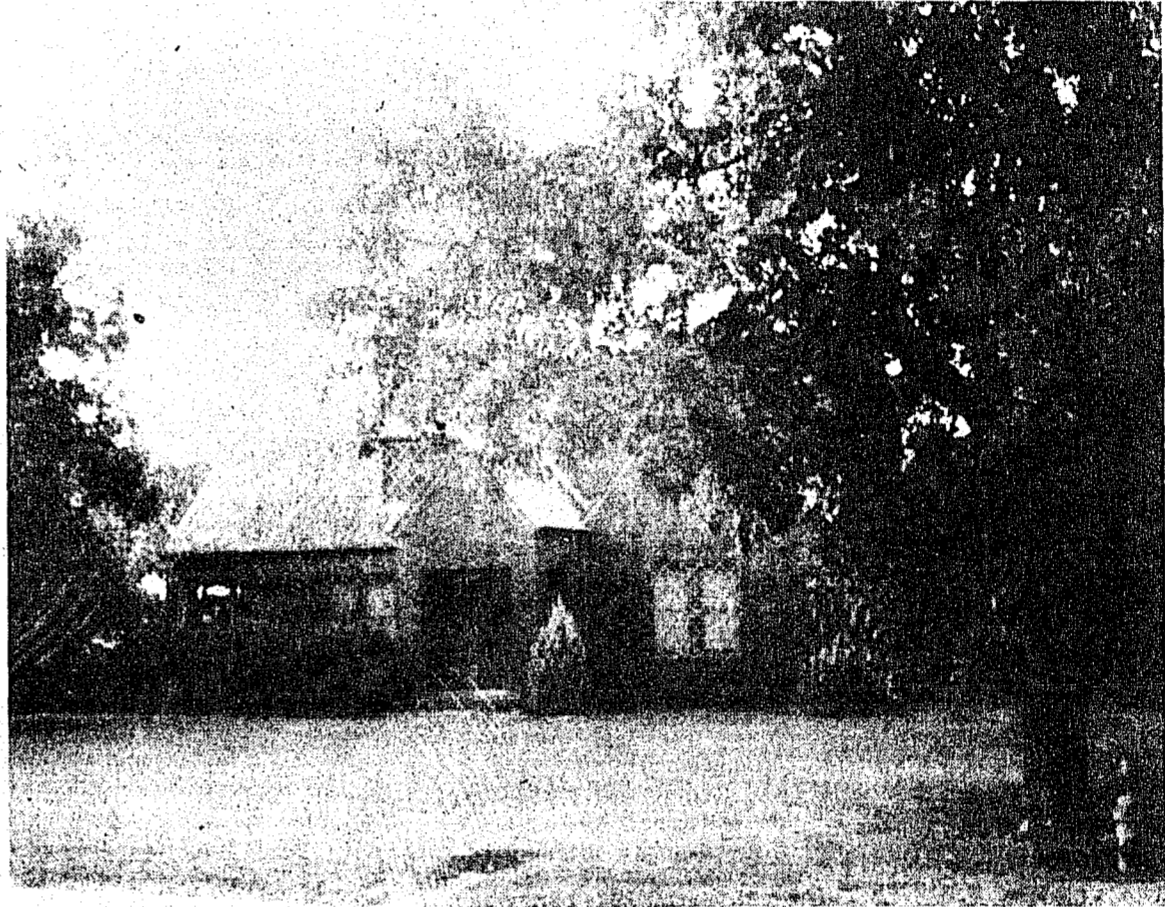
"The number of drug cases has increased dramatically with the work of the West Central Texas Interlocal Crime Task Force," Jones said. "Local law enforcement has also been doing a good job and that is putting added pressure on this office and the court. Creation of a district attorney's position will

result in more prosecutions and fewer plea bargains."

As felony prosecutor, Jones handles all felony and Juvenile cases in Coleman County. Jones estimates his office will dispose of close to 120 cases this year. All of the cases are heard by Judge Don Lane of the 42nd District Court out of Abilene.

The measure passed Sunday was then sent to the House of Representatives for their approval.

As of deadline time on Tuesday, the lawmakers were still struggling with trying to pass a budget.



Santa Anna ISD Students Return To Class Tuesday

CAP Starts Monday; SDA 26th

Students of Santa Anna Independent School District will return to class Tuesday, August 20 after almost three months vacation from the classroom. Teachers will have a workday on Monday in preparation for starting classes. They have been attending in-service training this past week.

Classes will start at Santa Anna schools at 8:00 a.m. and will dismiss at 3:16 p.m. Kindergarten through third grade will be dismissed at 2:30. Principal Dean Bass asks that any new student registering at the elementary school must provide birth certificate, Social Security Card and immunization records.

The CAP High School, a cooperative for Santa Anna, Coleman, Bangs, Novice, Panther Creek, Ballinger and Winters Independent School Districts, will begin Monday, August 19 with classes starting at 8:16 a.m.

CAP students need to check with the administration office in their school district this week for bus schedules, according to CAP principal, Dean Blair.

Opening day for the Santa Anna Seventh-day Adventist School will August 26, 8:30 a.m. Patsy Starr will be the teacher for the school year, 1991-92. The Santa Anna school is part of the education

system of the Texas Conference of Seventh-day Adventist and is recognized as being accredited with the Texas private School Accreditation Commission (TEPSAC). TEPSAC helps to ensure quality in private

Voters Made Choices Despite Confusion; Lottery Issue Next

Despite concern about confusion in last Saturday's elections, voters across the state seemed to pick and choose those issues they wanted to support while approving a proposed constitutional amendment that would clear the way for school property tax exemptions.

The other proposition on the proposed amendment ballot, that of bonds to finance college student loans, failed.

Coleman County voters did not go along with the statewide trend. They turned down Proposition 1 with a vote of 380 for "yes" and 451 "no". Neighboring Brown County spoke out loudly with a

"yes" vote of 517 and a "no" vote of 1,959. On Proposition 2, 352 Coleman County voters said "yes" while 475 said "no". Brown County voters echoed their sentiments on the second proposal with 645 "yes" and 1,820 "no".

In the CED (County Educational District) election area voters minimized their school district tax burdens, emphatically crushing a proposition that would have allowed the taxation of public property.

In Coleman County, where slightly over seven hundred voters cast ballots in the CED election, a proposition to allow taxation of

personal property not used in producing income, such as cars, boats, recreational vehicles, was defeated 668-43.

However Coleman County voters supported the other two proposals on the ballot, with 506 votes for homestead exemptions and 202 against; and 516 for exemptions for the disabled, 190 against.

All three proposals were soundly defeated in Brown County with voters seeming to tell lawmakers, "go back and try again, we just don't buy any of this."

The next issue to come before the voters will be the proposal to estab-

lish a state lottery. The Senate voted early Saturday to let Texans determine whether to establish a state lottery, after a much expected filibuster by Sen. John Leedom, ended when he became sick. He had talked some 7 hours and 17 minutes before he decided to call it quits, after which senators approved the lottery measure, a proposed constitutional amendment.

Senator Temple Dickson voted for the lottery in a preliminary vote but could not be contacted to come to the Capitol for the early morning vote. Dickson said they didn't really need him for the final vote because

they had plenty of support to pass the measure.

The Texas Constitution bans lotteries, so starting one requires approval of a constitutional amendment.

The proposal won approval of the House on Monday, the first time the chamber has approved it after eight unsuccessful tries since 1983.

Voters will go to the polls November 5 to cast ballots on the proposal.

If the voters OK the lottery, the numbers game will likely begin by next summer, according to Andy Welch, spokesman for the state

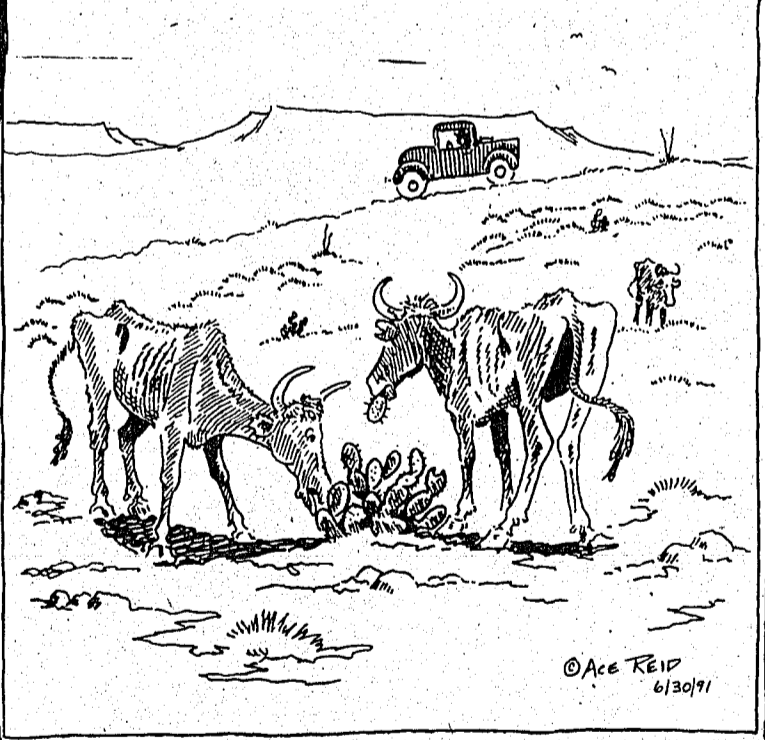

"This day I call heaven and earth as witnesses against you that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Now choose life, so that you and your children may live and that you may love the Lord your God, listen to his voice, and hold fast to him. Everyone is welcome to join in. A special invitation goes to friends in neighboring communities.

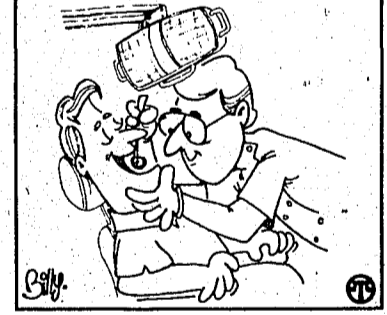

If your dentures begin to feel loose, or cause pronounced discomfort, see your dentist immediately.

Mr. Jones was born in Fisk on January 21, 1910 to the late William L. and Lena Jones, longtime pioneers of the Fisk area. On March 13, 1927, he was married to Alice

Cornelius in Coleman. A heavy equipment operator, farmer and carpenter, Mr. Jones was also a member of Harmony Baptist Church.

Survivors include his wife, Alice Jones of Fisk; two daughters, Frances Richardson and Freda Stephenson, both of Santa Anna; three sons, William Earl Jones of

Dred Scott

In the 1857 Supreme Court case of Dred Scott v. Sandford, the Court declared unconstitutional the already-repealed Missouri Compromise of 1820, because it deprived a person of his property — a slave — without due process of law. The Court also ruled that slaves were not citizens of any state nor of the United States. (The latter part of the decision was overturned by ratification of the 14th Amendment to the Constitution in 1868.)

Dear Editor

My lifelong and best friends were all "baby boomers" born following World War II. There were five of us young boys who, during the Vietnam War era, served in the United States Marine Corps, the United States Army, the United States Navy and the United States Air Force (two of us were in the Marine Corps). Why did we do that: because we believed in the United States of America and we still do.

Operation Desert Storm has renewed overwhelmingly the elusive patriotism of Americans that, on the surface, appeared to vanish during Vietnam. No longer were our veterans of war spat upon and called names, but were revered as the patriotic soldiers, sailors, Marines, and airmen they are.

Perhaps the most extensive and media covered events of the Desert Storm Victory celebration occurred in Washington, D.C., and New York City. But the display of support for our troops and the efforts of Americans did not appear on national television. They were displayed by millions of Americans in their homes in small towns - the heart of America.

My family and I attended the celebration in Washington, D.C. We live here. It was an outstanding and deserving event. As we drove in, my eight-year-old daughter asked me if we could also visit the Vietnam Memorial. We didn't, and she was disappointed, even though she has been there many times.

As my children scurried about having Desert Storm posters autographed by returning servicemen, I kept contemplating the number of American veterans, and their families who were not as fortunate as we who were also celebrating the return of their loved

ones, or grieving the loss of them in less grandeur. In a way, it was kind of sad because I felt like something was missing. But not for long.

I received a photograph of the citizens of Santa Anna, Texas, gathered in front of the U.S. Post Office, wrapped in a giant yellow ribbon in support of our troops. It was your Postmaster, Gary Absher - one of the "five young boys."

I framed the photograph and displayed it on the wall of the DNA Analysis Unit at FBI Headquarters in Washington. The photograph fit in well with the other symbols of support, since my staff had inundated the whole laboratory with miniature American flags and yellow ribbons.

Mr. Absher later sent me another photograph depicting the Veterans Park in Santa Anna with a Marine Sergeant in crisp dress blue uniform standing proudly in observance. That photograph is also displayed in my office near my Marine Corps sword. The Sergeant's Marine Corps motto is "Semper Fidelis" meaning always faithful. It is obvious that motto also applies to

the citizens of this country, in support of our troops, especially in towns like yours, where the efforts of our fighting men and women are appreciated, supported and remembered. It means a lot for all veterans of all American wars, and we appreciate it.

County Agent Advises, "Don't Jump The Gun On Pecan Weevil Spraying"

The pecan weevil is one of, if not the most damaging pests of pecans in parts of Central and South Texas. This insect lays eggs in the developing nut and the resultant larvae devour the nutmeat.

Most of the weevil's life cycle is spent in the soil. Adult weevils begin emerging from the soil in late July and early August and at the first sign of weevils, producers are often tempted to gear up and spray. Spraying at the first sign of pecan weevils is not recommended, simply because it is not cost effective.

Dr. Marvin Harris, pecan entomologist at Texas A&M University reports that early weevil emergence is always only a tiny sampling of what is yet to come.

Like clockwork in affected Central and South Texas locations, a handful of weevils begin emerging in early August but emergence doesn't begin in earnest until near August 20 with a historical average

of 10 percent emergence on August 22. After August 22, emergence increases rapidly with 50 percent emergence by September 1, 90 percent emergence by September 10 and 100 percent emergence by October 1.

Granted, the weevils that emerge in late July and early August will puncture a few nuts and cause them to drop, but the loss will be minor in relation to the cost of an insecticide spray. Also, this early nut drop won't contribute to weevil reproduction since the weevils aren't able to deposit eggs until the nuts reach the gel stage - in late August.

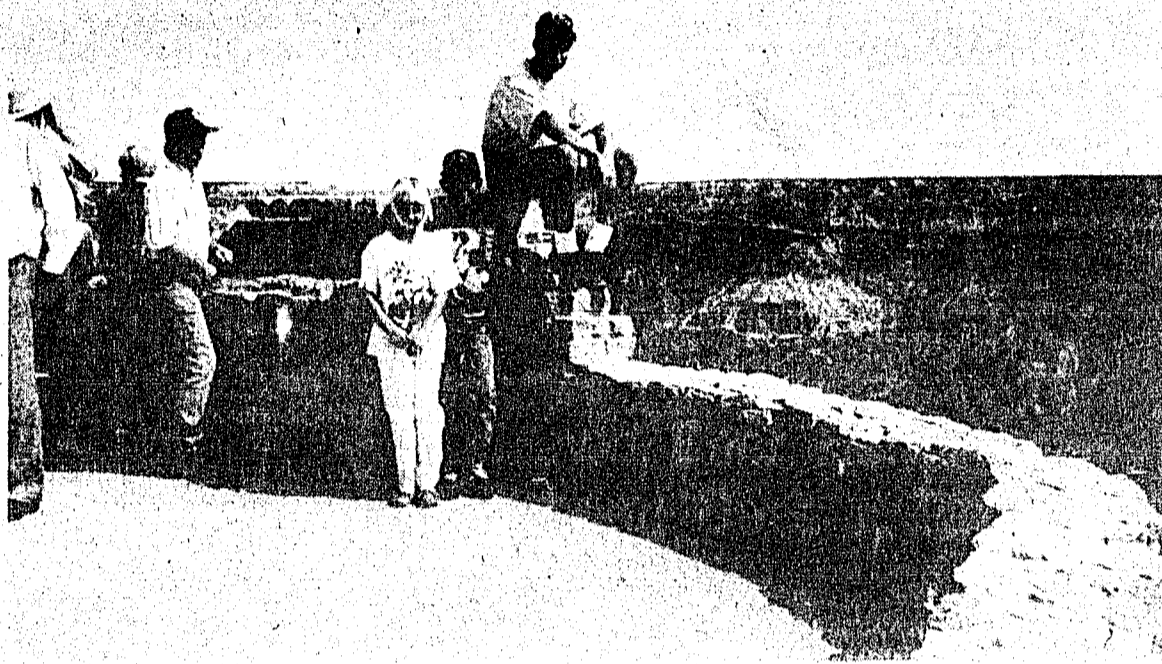
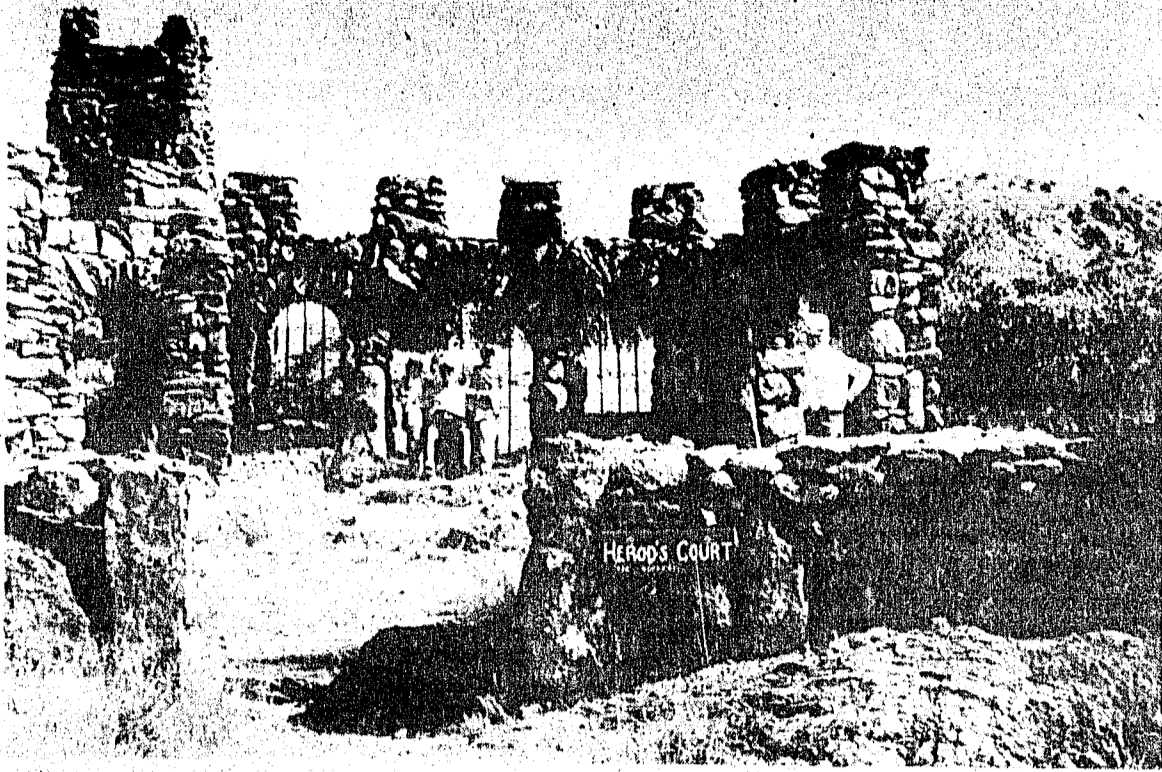
To get the most cost effective pecan weevil control, producers should expect to apply at least 2 sprays during the period of heavy weevil emergence. This will mean applying the first spray around August 22-24 when emergence is begun in earnest and then apply a second spray 10 days later to catch an additional major portion of the population. Carbaryl (Sevin), the

most common pecan weevil insecticide, offers only 5 to 7 days of residual kill so trying to effectively control weevils with just 1 spray is often impossible.

Use as a base for chilled dips, on baked potatoes or in salads.

Feeders...Are They Killing Your Wild Turkey?

WINTERS--Aflatoxin, a word unfamiliar to most of us but a substance that numbers among the most lethal in nature.

Aflatoxin is produced by the fungi *Aspergillus Flavus* or *A. parasiticus*. The toxin can be found on most grains such as milo, corn, rice, cottonseed and wheat that are grown under drought or stressful conditions. The toxin is frequently found in nuts, particularly peanuts.

The amounts of aflatoxin that can be harmful is expressed in parts per billion (ppb). The Texas Dept. of Agriculture indicated that for humans and lactating cows consumption be limited to no more than 20 ppb. Milk products are limited to not more than .5 ppb. Feed for beef cattle can go up to 300 ppb. Birds, such as turkey and quail, are most susceptible and can be harmed by aflatoxin levels as low as 20 ppb.

Waterfowl losses due to both peanuts and rice have been documented for years by the Texas Parks & Wildlife Dept.

Dr. Mick Robinson of the Texas A&M Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Lab indicated that aflatoxin depresses the immunosuppressive system in deer. The suppression of the immune system may result in deer mortality due to other related causes.

Aflatoxin is a cancer causing agent in humans. Human liver cancer 10 to 20 years later may result according to Abigail Trafford Brett, a writer for the American Chemical Society. She indicated some peanut butter has tested as high as 3700 ppb. Brett indicated that only half of the major peanut butter producers distribute products that are aflatoxin free.

Grain sorghum, although considered less troublesome than corn, can also contain high levels of aflatoxin. Hoyt Hager, business writer for the *Corpus Christi Caller-Times* indicated that the manager of Banquete Grain Co. said that 50 to 60 per cent of the truckloads of grain sorghum shipped during the 1990 harvest season by Banquete to the Port of

Corpus Christi was rejected due to aflatoxin.

Bobby Alexander of the Texas Parks & Wildlife Dept. indicated that half of the corn tested during 1990 by the Texas Dept. of Agriculture contained aflatoxin. Eighteen per cent of the samples had levels greater than 300 ppb. Thirty one per cent of the samples had levels 20 ppb or greater.

One of the main problems aflatoxin presents to wildlife is there is no minimum set for grain, seeds or nuts sold for wildlife feed. A lot of the grain with aflatoxin levels too high for livestock is probably marketed, for example, as "deer corn".

Deer Feeders do not usually exclude such birds as turkey and quail. The overall effect of aflatoxin levels greater than 20 ppb on these susceptible birds is unknown but it could be devastating said B. D. Davis, biologist for the Texas Parks & Wildlife Dept.

Chances are that if 31 per cent of

the corn had aflatoxin levels greater than 20 ppb and corn is fed several times during the year then wild

turkey have a good chance of being exposed to harmful levels. Turkey themselves help contribute to the problem as they range widely and make extensive use of feeders said Davis.

The corn or grain sorghum can appear bright and clean but still contain high levels of aflatoxin. Accurate tests are available for a cost of \$15.00 to \$36.00 per sample. However, submitting the samples and waiting for the results is both troublesome and time consuming. A lot of people work on the principle of "out of sight out of mind" and hope the corn they are feeding" wildlife is aflatoxin free, indicated Davis.

Both hunters and land managers alike have the responsibility of determining that the feed they provide for wildlife is not harmful. And presently no agency is going to do this for you.

A Grown Deer Herd—How Long Does It Take?
