 John C. "Jack" Hays, "RIP" (Rest in Peace) Ford, "Big Foot" Wallace and
Ben McCullough, all legendary leaders of the Texas Rangers, earned their reputations as Indian fighters during the years they guarded the
settements of Souther Texas. These were the years of the Texas settlements of Southern Texas. These were the years of the Texas
Republic and the early years of statehood. The Penatuhkah Comanche hepublic and the early years of statehood. The Penatuhkah Comanche territiory was the tront line of the contict between Comanches and

the battle of Plum Creek which followed were listed among the events which have been called "a sort of postgraduate course in Indian wariare from which the real leaders, such as Ben McCullough and Jack Hays, emerged." suffalo Hump, a Penatuhkah war chief, was in command of the Comanche rces in these events.
The Texans Revolution lured a group of remarkable men to Texas to assis Texans, in the fight for independence. When the Alamo was under siege assistance. The letter was sent throughout the United States. Travis' etter, news of the fall of the Alamo, and of he massacre of Fannin's men a the Texans. John C . Hays was among them. He arrived too late to fight in the briet revolution buy slayed and became the guardian of the southern exas setllements and "the leader and foremost spirit of the Rangers." Hays' Texas Rangers were successtul tor many reasons. The personal
courage intelligence and skill of Jack Hays made him a natual leader or ugged and independent men. He led through example and intormal authority rather than through the structure of tormal command. His Rangers lived off the land and could move quickly without the burden of extra supplies. This mimicked the organization of a Comanche war party and provided the mobility
them.

Comanches had the technological advantage until the invention of the Colt revolver, which first appeared in Texas in 1839. Until then the bow and arrow were superior weapons horseback there wer no dey could be used for rapid fire Rangers field lested the revolver and consulled with Colt regarding improvements. The revolvers were scarce until 1844 when an improved version became part of the armament of the Texas Navy. Hays equipped each of his men winh wo of he new Colis and an extra cylinder for both. The advantage of superior arms shitted to the Rangers. serious consequences for the Comanches, especially the Penatuhkahs, since hey were the band whose teritory was nearest to the areas protected by hese Rangers. A Comanche war chief visiting Bexar was said to have described one of the first encounters between his warriors and Hays's
Ranigers armed with revolvers to Bob, a triendly Delaware." Bob reported Rangers armed with revolvers to Bob, a friendly Delaware." Bob reported
hat the war chief asked him the identity of the white commander at the fight on the Nueces. Bob told him it was "Devil Yack". Bob reported the chief shoo, his head slowly and said,
I never want to fight him again. He had as many shots as I have fingers on my two hands. I lost half my wastiors in that battle, and
many more died along the route while eftuning many $m$
River.
Comanchep placed a high value on the individual warior. Bands were small and a lost watrior was ireplaceable. The psychologocical impacat of the deadly southern Texas were used to field test this weapon which 1 central and standard equipment for the United States Calvary to use against other bands and tribes. The revolver may have been as deadly later, but it was not as unexpectiled.
The conllict between Comanches and Texas Rangers changed dramatically an estimated one half of the band died of cholera. Thna and Old OWl, and sunvived the epidemic could not agree on new leadership.
