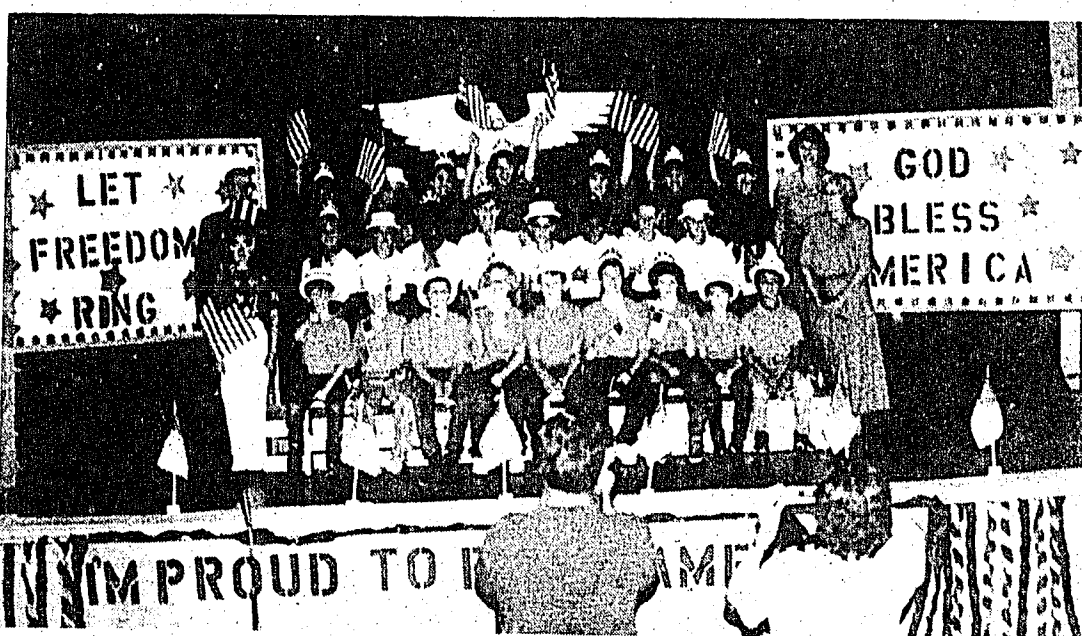

VFW Offers Flags For Veterans' Graves

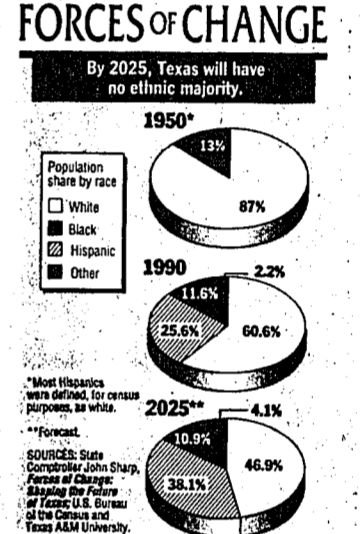
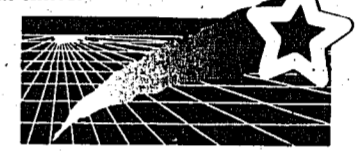

The rise after the recent rains have made blue cat and channel cat fishing real good up the Concho and Colorado rivers. For the high fin blues, worms seem to be the bait of choice. Yellow cat are being caught on perch.

Crappie have moved back to the deeper water and being caught at about 18-24 feet deep throughout the lake. Some rather nice size crappie are being reported.

As for this weekend, we expect lots of fishermen on the lake, but I am going to take a couple of days off and entertain some family and friends who will be visiting.

TxDOT Has Delays In Issuing Texas Certificates Of Title

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) has a new method of tracking Texas' vehicles. This Registration and Title System will ultimately make it easier and faster for owners to register and title their vehicles.

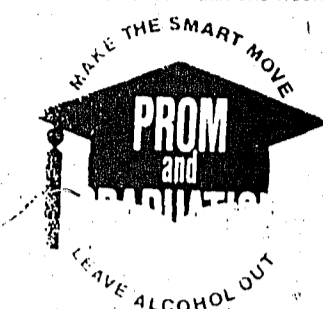
TxDOT recently converted 18.5 million Texas motor vehicle records to begin implementation of its new Registration and Title System. As a result of this conversion, vehicle owners will experience some inconvenience in receiving their Texas title, as the normal 6 to 8 week turnaround time for receiving a title is expected to take 12 to 14 weeks.

"We appreciate the cooperation and understanding of the public during this period," said Jerry Dike, director of TxDOT's Vehicle Titles and Registration Division. Dike estimates that it will take approximately one to two months to process the backlog of title applications and being issuing titles on the normal schedule of 6 to 8 weeks turnaround time. TxDOT usually

processes approximately 16,000 original titles each day.

Vehicle owners with critical reasons for receiving their titles prior to the estimated turnaround time may contact one of TxDOT's 17 regional vehicle title and registration offices for assistance or may call (512) 465-7611.

TxDOT's Registration and Title System will be phased in across the state and is expected to be fully operational by the end of 1995. Once the Registration and Title System is fully operational, vehicle owners applying for a Texas Certificate of Title should receive their titles within one week.
