Wheat Production Meeting By Marty Gibbs, CEA-Ag. Within the next monet or two farmers and ranchers in Coleman grain fields to wheat and oats. Each year, over 70,000 acres of smal grains are planted in Colema County for grazing and grain pro duction. Small grains are the Coleman County.
