Scartet Fever usually manifests in children or young adults as a comph; cation of a "strep throat" or from a strep skin infection. It is not, as common in years past, but it is still seen and because of it's sever Approximately half a day to wo days before the rash of scarlet feve ppears, there may be a sore throat, fever and a generalized "sick fecling" in severe cases, nausea, vomiting and joint pains may also be present. It always nemembered that two words not used in medicine are the words elf with and "never". With that in mind, scarlet fever can also present if is ill. The rash when it appears will first appear on the neck and upper body; hen spread downward to involvé the trunk and extremities, usually not flat, red, and if pressure is applied to it with the fingers, the area with blanch. On the face it appears as a flush that does not involve the area around the lips.
If scarlet fever
If scarlet fever arises from a skin infection the rash will be most intense If scandidin the inficeted area.
Complications of scarlet
Complications of scarlet fever can be severe. They include menigitis, Fortunately, heart damage, kidney disease and joint destruction. tibiotics are very effective. With timely treatment the serious conse quences are usually avoided and the illness rapidly regresces A word of caution and a plea. Before the medications are completed the patient will feel well and believe that completing the therapy is unnecessary. Please_finish your medicinest. If you do not, the consequences of that action will surface later.
Strep infections are serious. If the individual follows directions correctly, the illness can be a minor inconvenience; should directions be
nored, the future can be one of chronic illness, pain and shortened life.
