upcoming legislative session unless the Texas Supreme Court overturns the current public school finance law, according to Brad Reyn
an aide to Lt. Gov. Bullock. Reynolds said the Legislature' focus will shift to finding a new way to pay for schools if the high court rejects the finance system -
one that is being challenged for the fourth time singe 1989.
Presently, finds used to mun the state's public education system are taken from a mix of property taxes, and state and federal aid. Reynolds
said that if the high court once said that ifl the high court once
again declares the school-funding system unconstitutional, lawmakers may have to look at new sources of revenue, such as a value-added ta
on manufactured goods on manufactured goods.
But Bullock and House Speaker
Pete Laney, D-Hale Center, have
promised that there would be
no tax increase in the upcoming
biennium.
