## Telephone Cooperative Board Agrees To ELCS Election Pending PUC Approval

The Coleman County Telephone Co-op Board of Directors met last Thursday and voted unanimously to allow their membership the opportunity to vote on Expanded Local Calling Service (ELCS).

In the early part of the year, Hank and Daria Wise began a campaign to petition the Telephone Cooperative for toll free calling into Coleman from the six exchanges. The exchanges are Mozelle, Valera, Rockwood, Burkett, Lake Coleman and Santa Anna.

In March with over 300 signatures on petitions, the Wise appeared before the directors asking them to permit the people to vote

on the service. Following two hours of discussion, directors announced they would announce their decision at their May meeting.

According to the directors, the election will be held within fifty-two (52) days, as the ballot must be approved by the Public Utility Commission (PUC) before an election can be held.

Danny Kellar, manager for the Cooperative, explained that only the exchanges which vote in favor of the service will receive it.

The charge for members of the exchanges receiving the service will be \$3.50 per month for residential customers and \$7.00 to businesses.

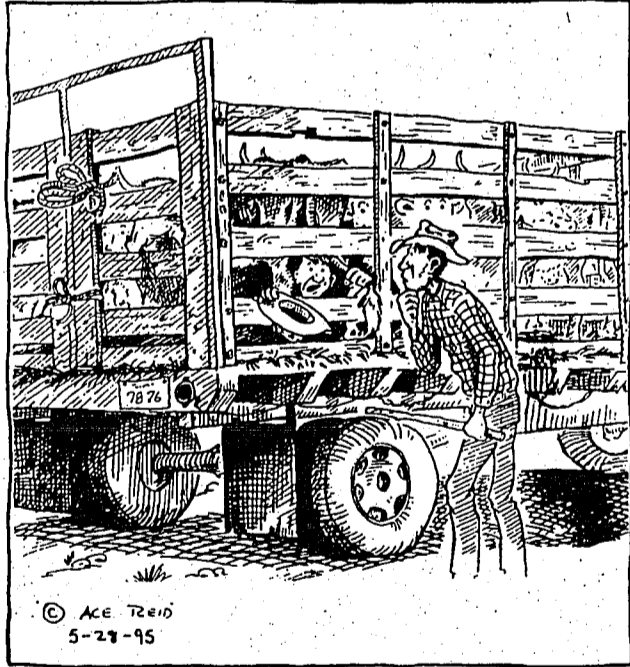

## Friendship Treaty Signed

During the treaty-signing ceremony at Frontier Day Saturday, Comanche Tribal Chairman Wallace Coffey presented Mayor Danny Kellar with a "war club" and quipped it could be used as an "attitude adjuster". Looking on are Congressman Charles Stenholm, an aide from Senator Bill Sims' office and County Judge Sherrill Ragsdale. Below is the friendship treaty that was read and signed Saturday at the ceremony.

Between the People of SANTA ANNA, TEXAS and the People of the COMANCHE NATION

hereunto signed for their respective peoples, the following treaty of friendship and cooperation has been entered into and agree upon.

The people of the Comanche Nation are welcome to visit the City of Santa Anna and its environs, and are welcome to visit those areas and sites formerly occupied by and sacred to their ancestors, those sites being protected by their present occupants.

In regard to those common projects into which the Comanche Nation and Santa Anna, Texas, agree to undertake for their common benefit, the people of Santa Anna seek to assure the people of the Comanche Nation that due respect will be accorded to their religion, customs and culture.

The People of the Comanche Nation and the People of Santa Anna shall endeavor to assist each other, insofar as is possible, in their common and separate ambitions toward economic, political and social benefit.

And finally, both parties agree mutually to use every effort to promote friendship and cooperation between both the Santa Anna and Comanche peoples and all other Texans, and to walk in the human path always and forever.

In writing we have hereunto set our hands, marks, and seals.

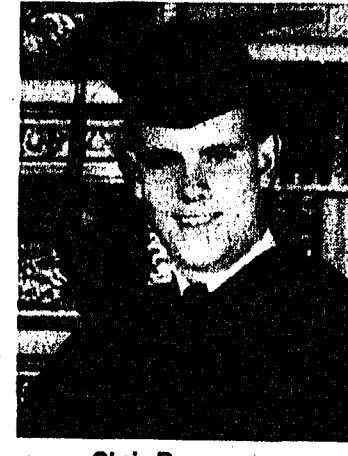

# WHAT TO DO WHEN THE LIGHTS GO OUT.



All too often, severe weather causes power outages. Wind, fallen tree limbs, and lightning can damage lines or equipment causing these outages.

Whenever an outage occurs, WTU works nonstop to restore your service as quickly as possible. We know the inconvenience outages cause — and we appreciate your patience and cooperation.

Here are some steps you can take to weather an outage safely — and with as little inconvenience — as possible.

### IN A POWER OUTAGE:

- CHECK IT OUT.**  
When your power goes out, check all fuses and breakers. If they're O.K., check with your neighbors. If power is out around you, CALL WTU. You'll find our number in your local phone book, or on your WTU bill!
- KEEP WTU PHONE LINES OPEN.**  
From the moment you call WTU, help is on the way — so a second call isn't necessary. Please leave our lines open for other callers.
- REPORT FALLEN UTILITY LINES.**  
If you see a fallen power line, don't even go near it! And, keep others away, too! Call WTU, the police, or the fire department immediately.
- UNPLUG APPLIANCES.**  
It's a good idea to turn off your air conditioner and unplug televisions, major appliances, and computers during storms. If you experience an outage, you may want to leave them unplugged until power is restored. Don't open your refrigerator or freezer unless absolutely necessary.
- BE CAREFUL WITH GENERATORS.**  
If you have access to a portable generator, please do not plug it directly into your circuit breaker box. It's unsafe — especially for repair crews. Plug appliances and lamps directly into the generator.
- PLEASE BE PATIENT.**  
You may see a WTU truck in your neighborhood leaving before your power comes back on. This is not unusual. We send people out to assess the extent and cause of an outage. The source of your outage might be several blocks away.
- CHECK ON YOUR NEIGHBORS.**  
Be mindful of neighbors who may have special needs.
- TURN YOUR FRONT PORCH LIGHT ON.**  
Turning on your porch light lets WTU crews know your electricity is back on.
- FOLLOW LOCAL NEWS MEDIA.**  
For updates on weather conditions and power restoration efforts, check local newspapers and radio broadcasts.
- KEEP AN EMERGENCY SAFETY KIT.**  
It's a good idea to keep things like flashlights, batteries, bottled water, and a battery-powered radio handy.
