### Santa Anna Varsity

The Mountaineers will open district play at Cross Plains Friday night at 7:30. Coach Robinett says the Mountaineers desperately need a win to have any shot at the playoffs. "We need to get on a roll," he said. Santa Anna is carrying a 2-3 non-district record into the game while the Buffaloes have a 0-5 record.

Irion County used a dominant rushing game to control the Mountaineers here last Friday night. The Hornets had 381 yards on the ground and 28 through the air to go on to defeat the Mountaineers 33-15.

Irion County scored first on a 10-yard pass from Gilbert Flores to Jo Jo Montes, and Flores' PAT was good. Flores scored in the second quarter from 4-yards out to make the score 13-0 at halftime.

Santa Anna made it close on a 11-yard run by Chris Lewis in the third quarter. Josh Lewis' PAT was good and they trailed by just 6 points 13-7, and that would be as close as they got.

Irion County scored once in the third quarter and twice in the fourth to salt away the game. Santa Anna scored with 1:54 left in the game for the final score of the game.

Richard Flores had 210 yards rushing and one touchdown for the Hornets, while Chris Lewis of Santa Anna rushed for 165 yards

and two touchdowns.  
Coach David Robinett recognized David Herrod for his performance on both offense and defense. David plays tight end and defensive linebacker.
