for a Centificate of Conivenience and Necessity (CCN) withite PUCT to construct 2.84 miles of 138 -Kilovolt ( kV ) transmission line and an associated substation southand east of the city limits of Coleman, Texas in Coleman County, Texas.

This application is filed in accordance with Sections 2.251, 2.252(a), and $2.255($ a)-(c) of the Public Utility Regulatory Act
(PURA) and the PUCT $23.3!(\mathrm{c})(\mathrm{l})$.

The proposed transmission line will provide service to a new substation which will increase the capacity of the interconnection between WTU and the City of Coleman and provide for a new delivery point for Coleman County Electric Cooperative. The proTexas ine is situated south and east of the city limits of Colcman, will join WTU's a coloman County, Texas. The proposed line mission line at approxing Ballinger to Santa Anna 138 -kV crans114 and 1100 feet north of the intersection of County Road 114 and the Santa Fe Railroad (approximately 3 miles south and east of the City of Coleman, Texas).
