Mrs. Hensley states, however, the Wellness Center located at 106 N. 2nd in Santa Anna will remain in operation providing the highest quality medical care for all the family. She says, "We will continue to function as we have with Dr. Donald Pope as Medical Director."

Mrs. Hensley adds that it is essential that patients of the Wellness Center stop by to let the staff know if you want your records

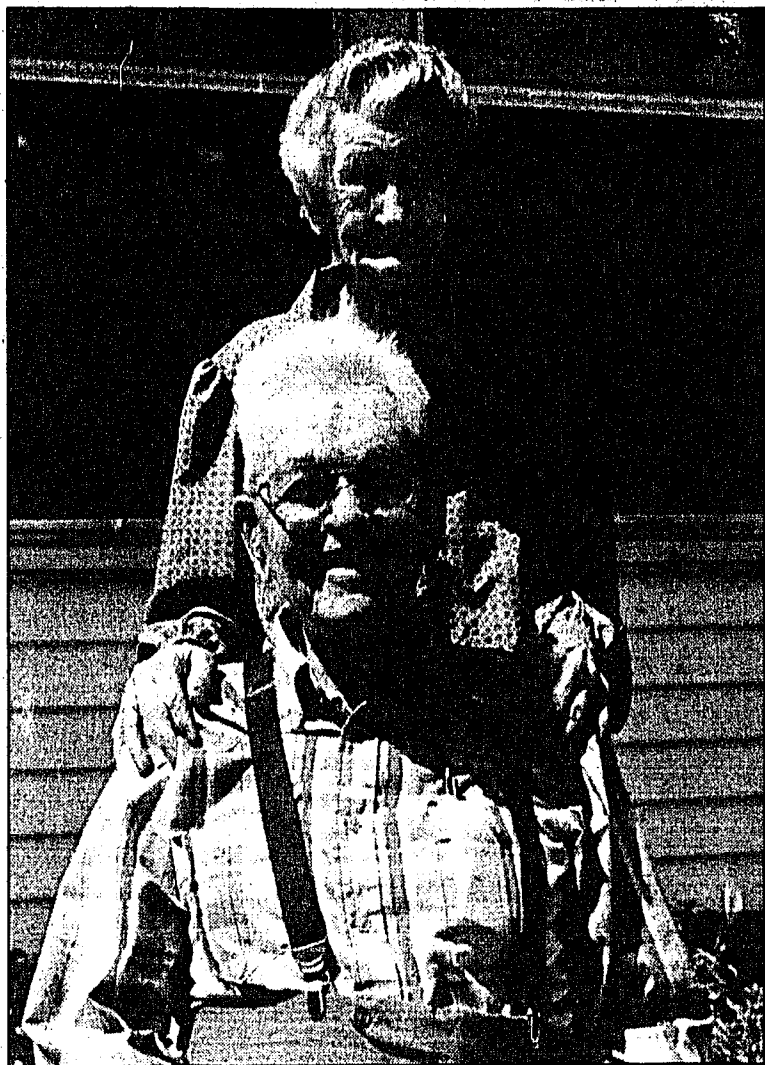
Elementary Students To Be Honored In Assembly April 11

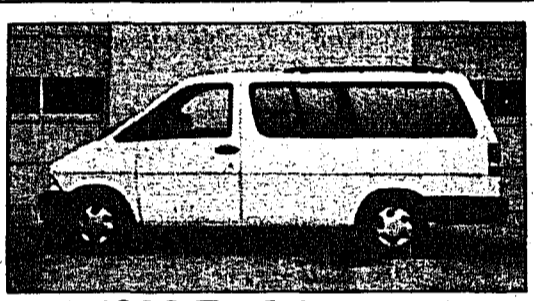

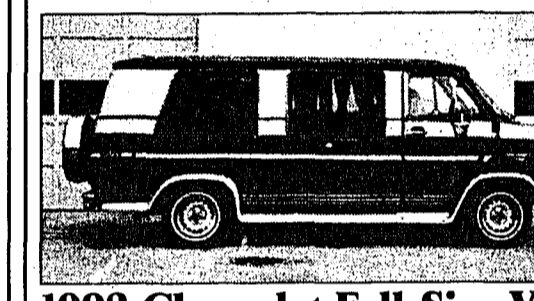

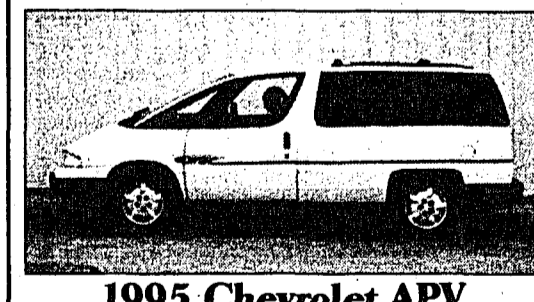
