Pond Management Seminar May 28 In Coleman Park

A farm pond management seminar will be held on Tuesday, May 28, beginning at 10:30 a.m. at the Coleman City Park. This program is designed to answer questions on farm pond management and will cover topics such as aquatic weed control, nuisance pest control such as turtles, beaver and nutria, pond fertilization, clearing muddy ponds, and pond aeration. The guest speaker for the seminar will be Dr. James Davis, Extension Fisheries Specialist from Texas A&M University. Feeding fish will also be discussed by Jimmy Harris, Acco Feed Representative.

Following the morning program, a complimentary fish fry will be served at noon.

Licensed private applicators will receive 1.5 hours of continuing education credits toward recertification of their license.

City Council Discusses Raising Meter Deposit

The Santa Anna City Council met for their regular monthly meeting on Tuesday, May 14, 1996 with Mayor Pro-Tem Bobby Morgan, and councilmen Robert Noriega, Jim Spillman and Karen Morris present. Others present included Matt Davis of Lone Star Gas; Ken Martin of Jacobs and Martin Engineers; Jackie and Mary Ann Smith; Chief of Police Carlos Torres; Superintendent of Operations Tommy Jackson; and City Secretary Alys Pelton.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved and the police report was reviewed.

An ordinance allowing Lone Star Gas to modify the cost of service adjustment and mainline extension rate and to propose a weather normalization adjustment was approved by member of the council.

Ken Martin, engineer for Jacobs and Martin Engineers, presented the council with plans and layout for the new sewer line in the west side of town and the elimination of the west lift station located behind the

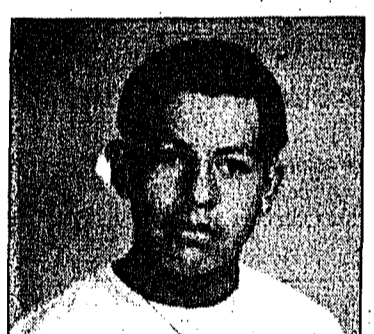
storage units on the west end of Wallis Avenue. Martin has assisted the city with the community block grant to be used for this purpose. The next step will be to advertise for construction bids.

The City of Santa Anna has received a letter from the Coleman County Nutrition Center informing them that there will no longer be Title III monies available. These monies are paid to the Santa Anna Center for persons over 60 who receive a meal or ride in the van. The Santa Anna Center will now rely on their own funds to support the center.

Robert Noriega, the Santa Anna Development Board chairman, presented the council with copies of the proposal to update the National Guard Armory to house a Head Start Program along with the current occupants of the building. Emmitt Payne of Central Texas Opportunities will be applying for grants to finance the proposal.
