52.3 billion. This basically has come about for three reasons: First the Texas state legislature intentionally over estimates expenses and under estimates expected revenue. Ifeel this is good
policy when figuring the' state policy when figuring the state
budget for a two-year period. Second, state agencies underspent their budgeted agpenciesitures by $\$ 484$ million. Third, there was increased revenue above projections
(primarily revenue from sales tax (primarily revenue from sales tax,
motor vehicle taxes, interest on state veposits and lottery) in the amount of $\$ \$ 73$ million. It might
be noted that the economy of the be noted hat the economy of the
State of Texas is healthier and State of Texas is healthier and
functions well above the national average. Nearly one-fourth of all new jobs created in the United States during 1995 were created in Texas, which is definitely a contributing factor in our ability to
achieve this level of budget surplus. Unlike the Federal constitution, the Texas constitution prohibits unlimited debt creation through "printing more currency" and the issuance of revenue producing constitution only provides for the sale of bonds for specific purposes, all of which must be approved by the voters. The Texas state
