The award-winning Oklahona artisans offer unique, one-of-a-kind designs, using precious gifts from Mother Earth. Their work is found across the United States.
The beadwork is hand-stitched one bead at a time on buckskin, other clothing or on a loom in
Southern Plains Traditional Style, Southern Plains Traditional Style,
creating jewerry and a wide variety of accessories. Beads were a trade item throughout early history. Drums are made by Roger in Southern Plains Tradition. This is
the oldest musical instrument the oldest musical instrument known to man. The drumbeat is
the heartbeat of Nother Earth; combined with song, it speaks infinite meanings to man's mind and
heart. The Plains Indians had a heart. The Plains Indians had a song for every moment of life.
