Unfortinately
Unfortunately, there is a flip side. Used carelessly, credit cards
can land you in a world of trouble can land you in a world of trouble,
debt, and ever-escalating costs. For example, if you have a high bal ance and pay only the minimum each month, many cards will not be paid off for 20 years or more. As a consumer, your best
course of action is to pay off your course of action is to pay off your
charge-card debt every month and charge-card debt every month and
avoid high interest costs. Consider making it your top financial priority. But there are other things you should know as a smart consumer That is why we at the Office of the Attorney General have put together the following advice.
Terms to know
Get to know the language of credit card agreements. All offers
contain terms like APR, annual fee and grace period.
The letters APR stand for the annual percentage rate, which can
vary considerably. The lower the vary considerably. The lower the
number, the less you pay in inter-
number, the less you pay in inter-
The annual fee is what the
bank charges you to hold their credit card. Some cards have no
annual fee - be sure to ask. If you annual fee - be sure to ask. If you pay an annual fee, call your card
issuer. Many issuers will negotiate issuer. Many issuers will negotiat
the fee or eliminate it entirely if the fee
asked.
The grace period is the length of time from the date your monthly statement is issued to the date you
have to make a payment. Interest begins to accrue on your purchases on the payment date. Some cards allow no grace periods - you always will pay interest - and oth-
crs give you up to a month to pay ers give you up to a month to pay.
Each variable can affect your balance and pay-back period conbalance and pay-back period con-
siderably. It is conceivable that a card with a lower interest rate can end up costing you more than a card with a higher interest rate. For example, assuming a monthly balance of $\$ 2,000$ over a year, you
can pay $\$ 250$ in interest on a card can pay $\$ 250$ in interest on a card
with a 12.5 percent interest rate with a 12.5 percent interest rate
and no annual fee. Another card, charging you an interest rate of 8.75 percent and an annual fee o $\$ 90$, can cost you $\$ 265$ over the
same time period. same time period.

be less useful. Be sure to read the provisions carefully before you decide.
What the offers don't say
Some agreements allow the card issuer to change the terms on short notice, then demand that you comply. Mail offers for so-called "pre-approved" cards may omit crucial details found in the agree-
