## Mountaineers Shut Out By Buffalos Junior High And Junior Varsity Also Fall To Buffalos


The Santa Anna Mountaineers fell to the Cross Plains Buffalos 28-0 last Friday night before a large homecoming crowd.

"Any Texan, any age, can get a photo ID card at any DPS Driver. License Office." said Frank Elder. deputy administrator of the DPS Driver Licensing and Control Bureau. "People who don't have a driver license often find themselves in need of an official photo ID.
