



State Requirements For High School Graduation To Change In 1997

Secondary education in Texas is beginning efforts to address the needs of a twenty-first century world. Partly a result of the process three years ago called "Real" World Issues and Needs", this effort is designed to reform public education in Texas in order to prepare our children to cope with a high-tech global society and

economy. One aspect of this change in perspective is changed graduation requirements. In the past, Texas schools offerd "regular", "advanced", and "advanced with honors" diplomas. Beginning with the freshman class of 1997, students will be able to earn a "minimum". "recommended" or "distinguished

achievement" diploma.

These new graduation programs differ significantly from what now exists. More specific requirements will be necessary. Students will have fewer elective choices. More credits will be required. While all these things have been the case at Santa Anna High School for several years, we also will see some changes.

Presently the administration at SAISD is studying the new requirements and seeking ways to address them in a cost-efficient. manner. At the same time the school continues to focuss on what is best for the education of our community's children. Without

question, some changes will come.

Many are aware of our computer labs which are the envy of many 2-A schools. The district has employed a teaching Technology Coordinator who keeps up on the leading edge of new developments in technology. Distance learning, whereby our students as well as citizens in the community can earn college credit, is on the horizon. Other changes in curriculum are under scrutiny.

As we prepare our students for the new millenium, we strive to maintain communication and cooperation with the community at large.
