



I have fond memories of Santa Anna and still have friends and relatives there.



In 1845, settlers in Prince Carl of Solms-Braunfels' new colony trimmed native cedar trees as they had decorated fir and spruce in Europe. The next year, when some 120 moved on from New Braunfels to found Fredericksburg, the tradition was continued there.

The United States got Texas as a Christmas present in 1845 although the gift was four days late. On December 29 of that year, Congress accepted the constitution of the new state of Texas. That marked Texas' formal entry into the Union.

Yes, Bethlehem is in Texas. It's a hamlet in Upshur County, Bethlehem also survives as the name of sites in Angelina, Bowie, Cass, Collin, and Marion counties, while Bethlehems in Smith, Van Zandt, and Milam counties have disappeared.
