AUSTIN - The state Senate ap. roved a $\$ 83.3$ billion state budget ast week that would increase fundsocial services programs. But the 1998-99 budget does not include pay raises for state mployees and education programs such as Gov. George W. Bush's
$\$ 470$ million reading initiative and $\$ 1$ billion back-to-basics program sought by university of ficials to increase the number of graduates. "Higher education pay raises ave been forced to take a back seat o public education and prisons," Senate Finance Committee Chairman Bill Ratliff, R-Mount Pleasant.
