COL. CROCKETT BOONE DIES AT VAN HORN

Col. Crockett Boone, familiarly known to Santa Anna people as Uncle" Crockett, died yesterday pneumonia, at Van Horn, Texas where he had gone some months since to accept an editorial position
with the Van Hon Clom with the Van Horn Chronicle. His buried at Santa Anna early youth his father moved 'to Franklin county, Arkansas, and here
at the age of nine he began work on at the age of nine he began work on
a paper published at Ozark. He was only fifteen when the bloody struggle between the states began, but he immediately espoused
