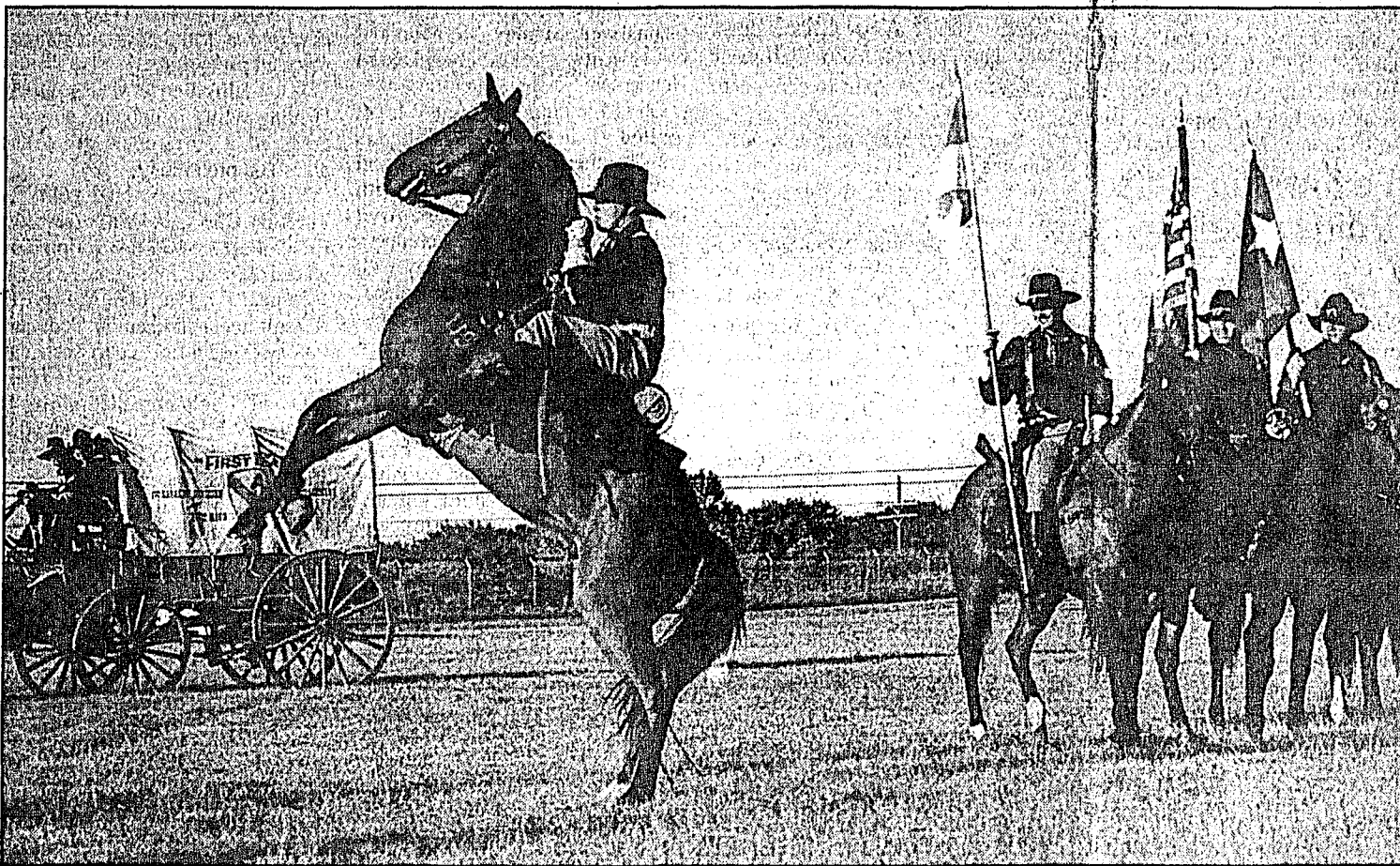

The Santa Anna Mountaineers fell to the Bears last Friday evening in Baird 28-20.

Josh Roberson scored in the first quarter giving the Mountaineers a 7-6 lead. The run from the 6-yard line was completed with the extra point from Adam Garza.

With a halftime score of 21-7 in favor of the Bears, Santa Anna came back in the second half with Chris Boyet scoring on a 40-yard run. Roberson added the final touchdown running from the five yard line. Garza once again added the extra point.

Josh Roberson ran for 94 yards on 13 carries with Chris Boyet running for 87 yards on 11 carries.

Clay Crossley caught a 11-yard pass during the game and Chris Guerrero had 44 yards on a pass.

The Mountaineers had 269 yards with Baird coming up with 337 yards.

Monday afternoon Chris Guerrero received Offensive Player of the Game honors with the Defensive

Player of the Game award going to Josh Roberson. These honors are announced each Monday by the coaching staff.

This Friday evening the Mountaineers host the Rising Star Wildcats at Mountaineer Stadium with a 7:30 p.m. kickoff.

According to Head Coach David Robinett, "Rising Star is not big in size but they are very fast. They have a good quarterback. They like to run the option and throw."





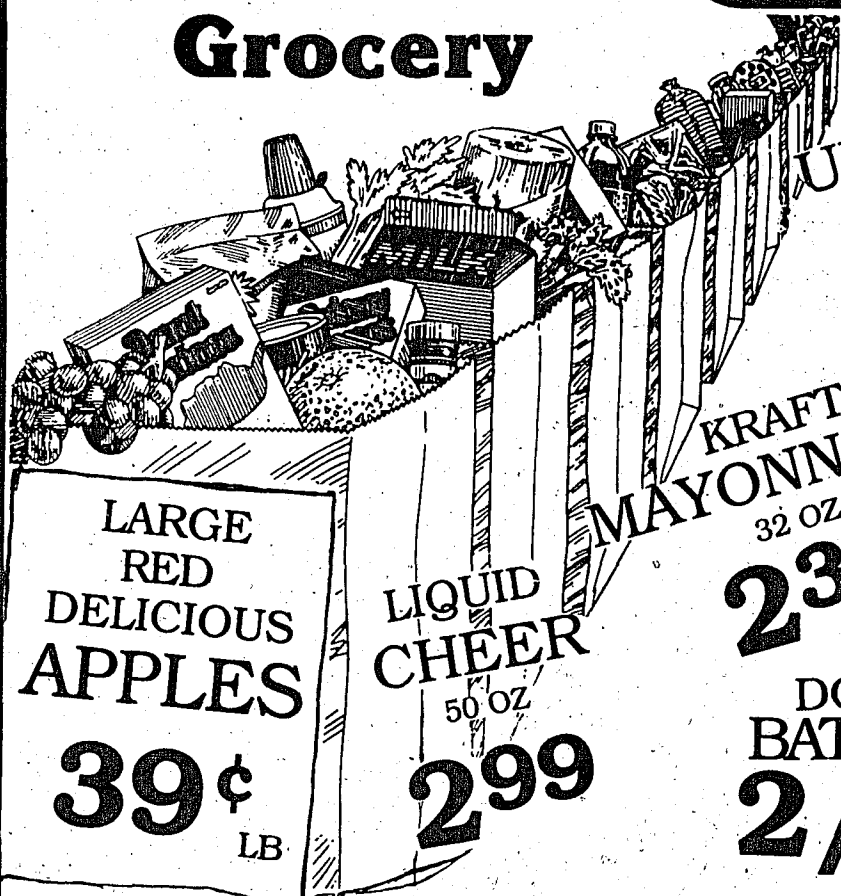
