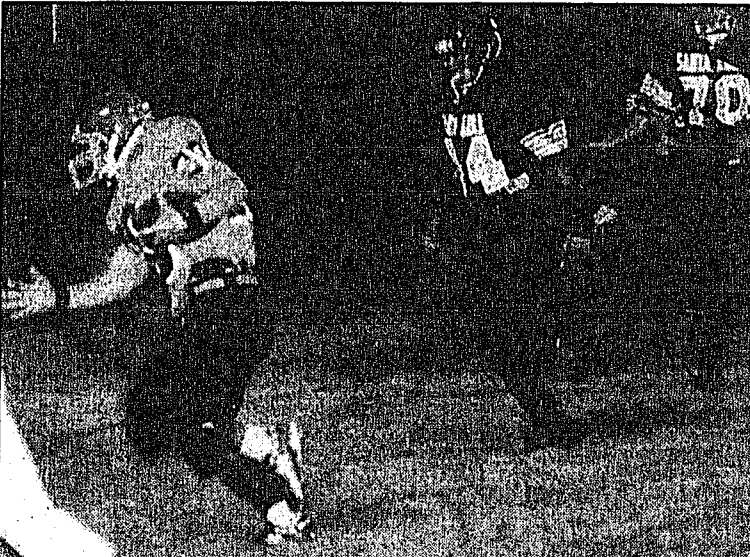

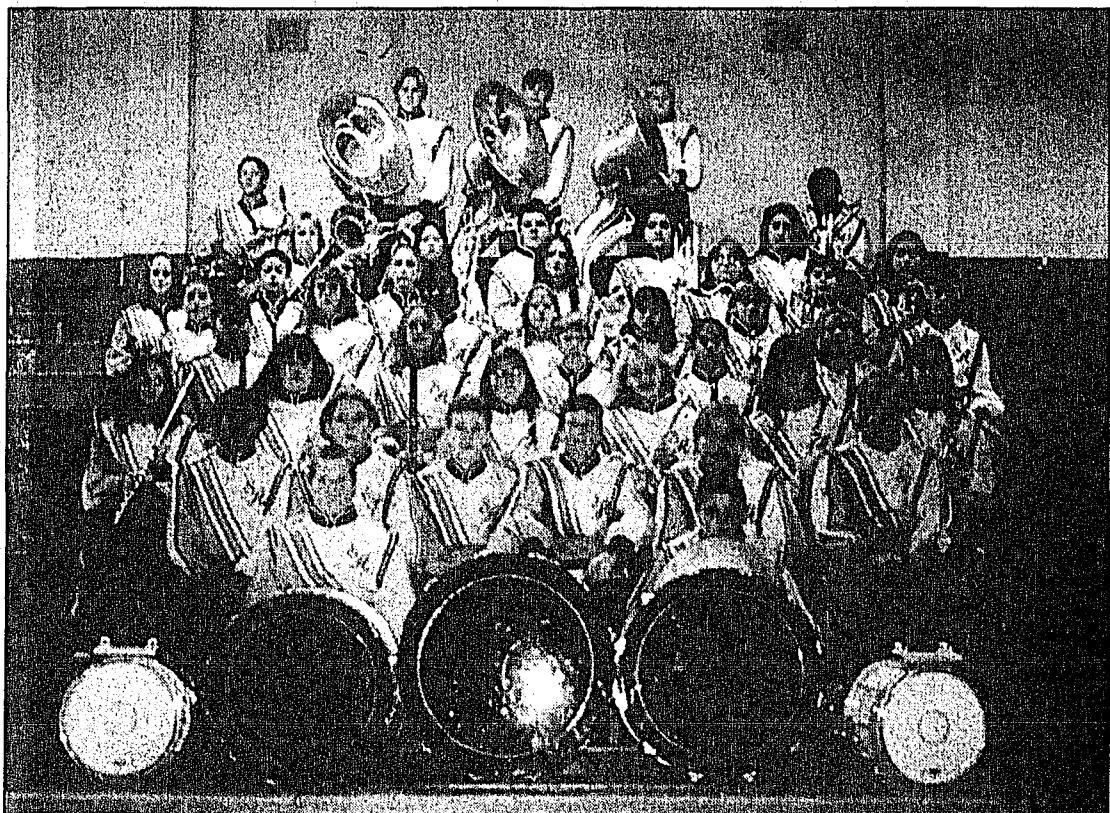

He was preceded in death by his son, Travis Allen in 1978 and brother Odus Allen in 1966.

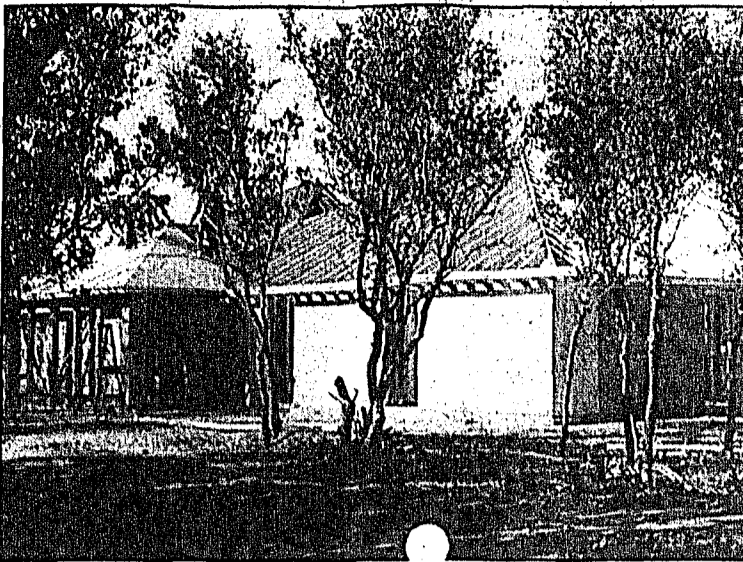
### Gary Hosch
