



At the end of World War II. Camp Bowie sold their buildings. Santa Anna bought and sold all but one of theirs. Most were bought by returning veterans to build homes. Representatives of the Garden Club, Daughters of the Confederacy and Self Culture Club went to the mayor and asked for the remaining building for a club house--library.

They were turned down. The women's answer--there is an election soon.

Officials, changed in that election, and the women received their library. They worked themselves, got volunteers and paid for the remodeling. Until a few years ago we were located in that barracks.

Mrs. Blue helped with summer reading--refreshments and donations. She could always answer questions of who and what happened in the
