When people stop by the gas station for a fill-up, they find some good news and some bad news printed right on
the pump. The bad news has always been that roughly third of the price of a gallion of gasoline went to the government in taxes. The good news was that the money went to

That's about to stop, and Texas drivers are going to benefit.
The Senate has now passed a highway bill which provides $\$ 10.866$ bilof hard work in trying to get the federal government to live up to its comait ment to use gasoline taxes to build and repair roads.

In addition to Texas' $\$ 10$ billion share, this bill creates a $\$ 450$ million trade corridor-border infrastructure fund to finance such programs as the spe-
cial 'NAFTA Highway' designations that are being soughif or I-35, the planned I-69 in South and East Texas and the I-10/I-25 link at El Paso
