### Frontier Heritage Festival Set For Saturday At Local Rodeo Grounds

Including World Championship Bison Cookoff

The annual Frontier Heritage Festival is set to give you the sights and sounds of frontier times when the gates open at 9:00 a.m. Saturday at the rodeo arena located on the San Angelo highway just west of town.

The festival will be the site of the World Championship Bison Cookoff with judging to take place at 11:00 a.m. The bison meat will then be included in a meal to be sold starting about 12:30.

There will also be a bean cookoff with judging at 10 a.m. and a

brisket-cookoff with judging at 12 noon.

The Festival, sponsored by the Santa Anna Historical Development Organization, will feature living history exhibitions throughout the day. Included will be Spinning, weaving, shuttle weaving, lye soap making, black powder craftsmen, and pottery making.

A show by riders from Fort Hood historical 1st Cavalry will present thrilling riding maneuvers at 2:30 p.m.

A delegation of the Comanche

Nation will attend bringing tribal singers, dancers and drummers who will perform throughout the day.

All kinds of arts and crafts of with a western frontier flavor can be seen, along with hand carvings from buffalo bones by Euel Perry, a Native American from Crosbytown. A saddle and blanket maker will be among the craftsmen.

The Comanche Indian people will visit the Santa Anna Elementary School on Friday as part of a cultural enrichment program.

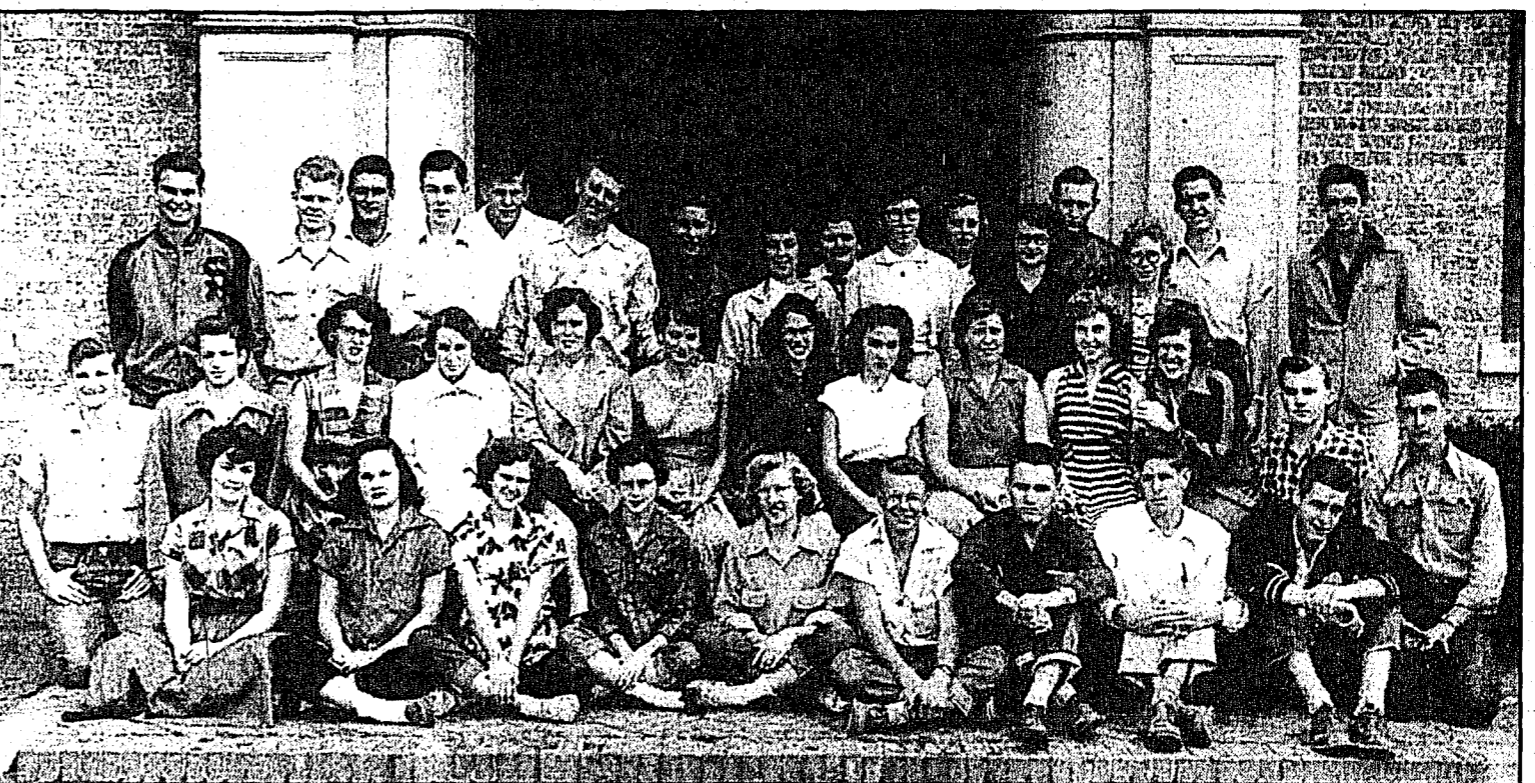

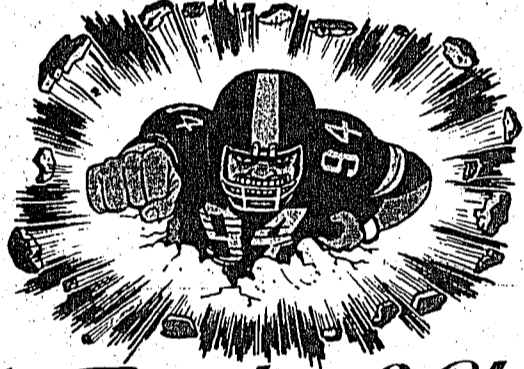

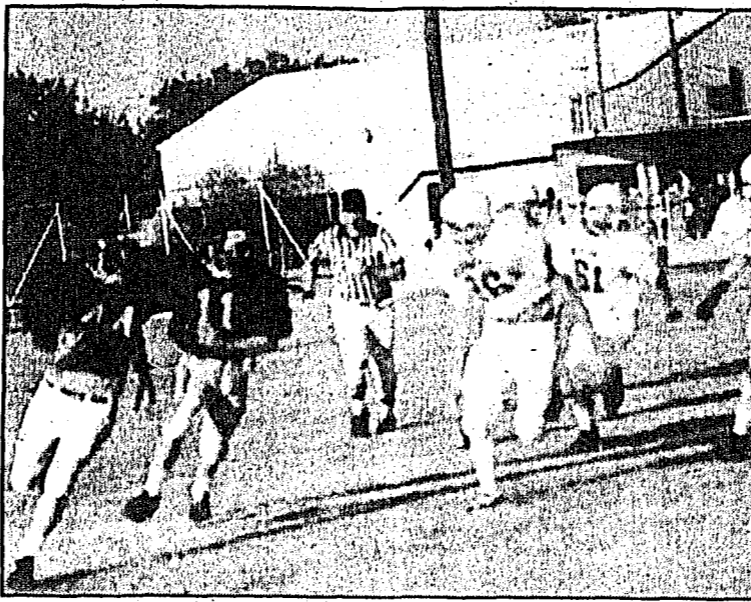


### Volleyball News

**Marie Wristen Frenzy Winner**

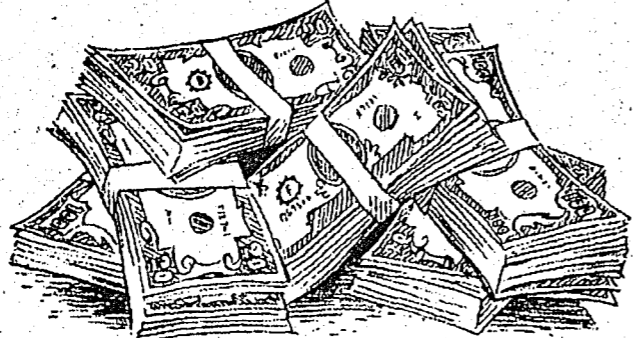

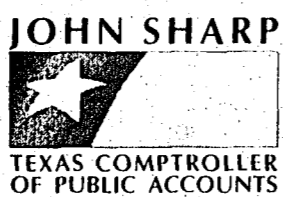
