Rep. Bob Turner Files Two Bills To Assist Counties
AUSTIN--State Representative
Bob Turner, D-Voss, filed two bills in the Texas House this week to assist counties. The first bill pro-
poses to give counties the authority poses to require a plat be approved by the county to subdivide certain property. The second bill is legislation Rep. Turner has filed in previous
legislative sessions to assist rura legislative sessions to assist rural
counties with the cost of trying capital murder cases.
H.B. 423 proposes to assist counties in preventing landowner and developers from subdividing providing prospective buyers with basic infrastructure. With the remendous growth in Texas has

for the plat is denied, the landowne would be prohibied from subdividing the property. This authority allows the commissioners court to ensure any plat to subdivide prop-
